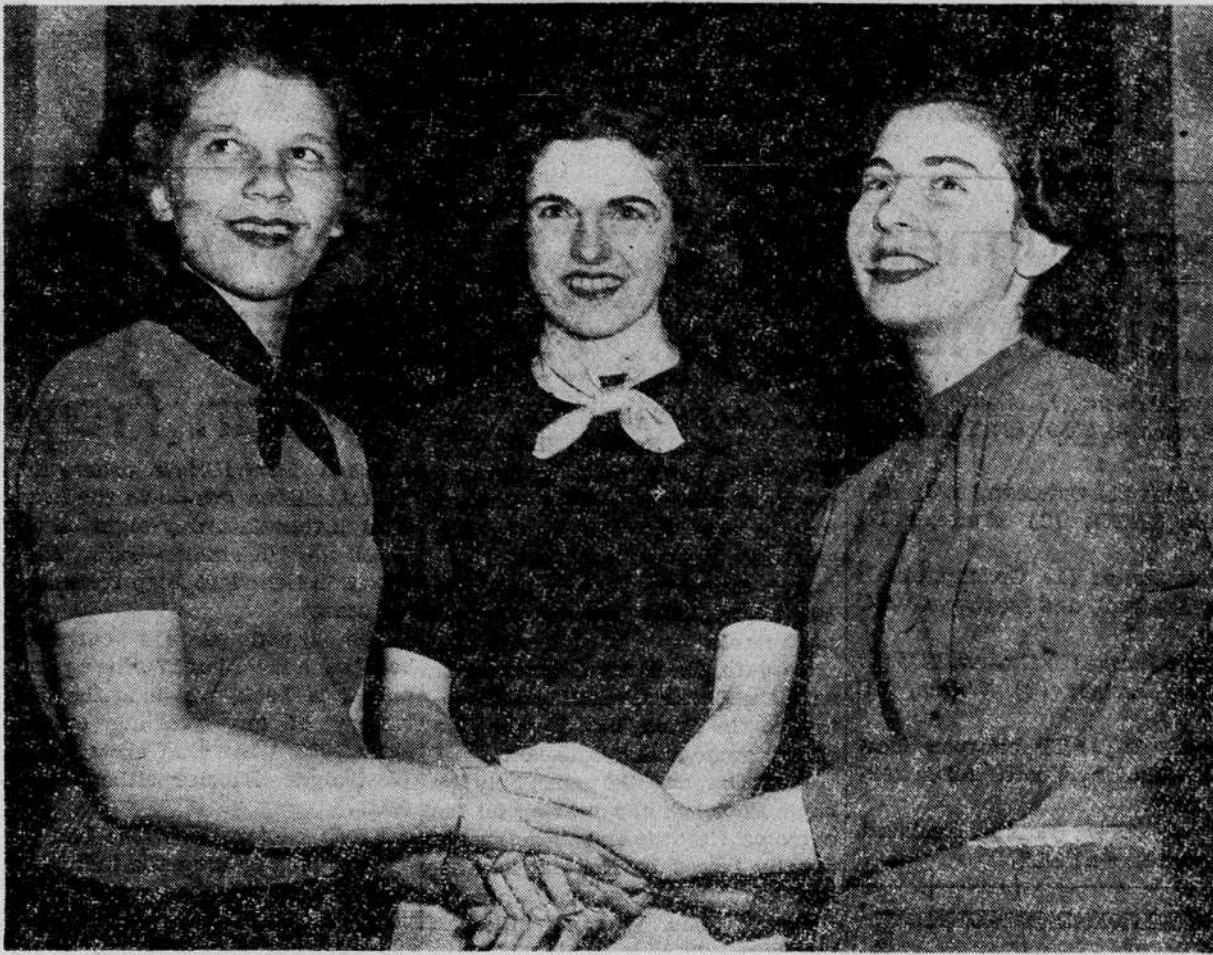
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Women's Election Winners

Saturday's program will open with speeches and discussion by a panel of foreign students at 8:30. After short committee meetings, the conference will hold its final session. Officers will be elected and students will discuss committee reports and recommendations.

Topics

Specific topics to be considered by the committees are:

What are the probabilities and conditions for the success of the Marshall Plan? Can the U. S. and new China come to satisfactory terms? What kind of U. S. tariff policy is best for peace and prosperity? Can the German problem be solved?

What kind of policy should the U. S. pursue with respect to Yugoslavia? Will the North Atlantic Pact make for peace or war? Is U. S.-Latin American friendship based on opportunism? Will the bold new program of economic and technical development of underdeveloped areas promote peace and prosperity?

Study Guide

C. P. Schleicher, professor of political science and general director of the conference, has edited a study guide to aid the delegate in their consideration of these subjects.

Contributors are Paul S. Dull, associate professor of political science and history; Ivan G. Nagy, assistant professor of political science; E. C. Robbins, instructor in economics; Gordon Wright, professor of history; Robert M. Hooker, professor of Latin-American history at Pacific University;

Schleicher is executive secretary of the International Relations Committee of the Oregon Education Association. The OEA and the University are joint sponsors of the conference.
