

Jack Fina, Orchestra To Perform March 10

Smooth, sophisticated dance melodies will be featured by Jack Fina and his orchestra at Willamette Park Friday, Mar. 10.

Known as Jack Fina and his "Ten Talented Fingers," Fina gained fame for his modern interpretations of Tchaikowsky and Rachmaninoff while spotlighted at the piano with Freddy Martin's orchestra.

Fina left Martin three years ago to organize his own orchestra and since has been gaining new fame as a maestro in his own right.

His recording of "Concerto" with Martin is nearing a sales of 2,000,000 and is one of the five all-time top recordings. Altogether Fina's arrangements have sold more than 10,000,000 records. The most pop-

Athletic Group Tries Members With 20 Tests

In answer to considerable inquiry about the athletic honorary fraternity, Sigma Delta Psi, a statement of explanation was issued recently by E. R. Knollin, professor of health and physical education.

A Sigma Delta Psi class will be held spring quarter at 2 Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Knollin will instruct in the course.

He said, however, that it is not necessary to register in the class to take the tests for membership. Candidates may make appointments with instructors for the tests and have their record transferred to Knollin. Results of the test will be posted.

"Sigma Delta Psi is not just one more of the thickening swarm of Greek letter societies," he said. "There is just one way to gain membership. In the presence of a responsible committee one must meet about 20 widely diverse athletic tests."

The tests are: 100-yard dash, 11 3/5 seconds; 120-yard low hurdles, 16 seconds; running high jump, 5 feet; running broad jump, 17 feet; 16-pound shot, 30 feet for over 160 pounds; 20-foot rope climb; baseball throw, 250 feet (or javelin 130 feet); football punt, 120 feet; 100-yard swim, 1 minute 45 seconds.

1-mile run, 6 minutes; forward handspring; handstand, 10 seconds; fence vault, chin height; good posture according to the Harvard body mechanics test, and scholarship equivalent to varsity eligibility.

Tickets are on sale at both Thompson's downtown and campus music stores. Student tickets are \$1.

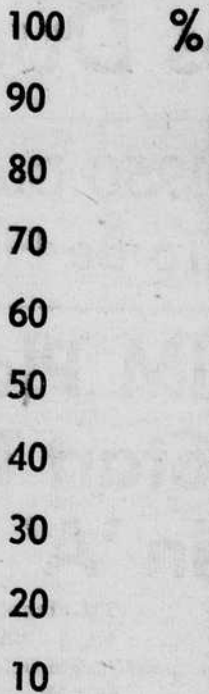
15 Percent of Quota Reached In Campus Red Cross Drive
