

University Drive to Begin April 3 For World Student Service Fund

From Apr. 3 to 7 Oregon students will be given the opportunity to take part in a world-wide venture, which involves 36 countries and serves to bring students of all nationalities into a working relationship with each other.

This is the World Student Service Fund drive, commonly known as WSSF. Beginning after the First World War in 1919, WSSF has been helping meet the relief needs of students in war-devastated areas and has been building cultural ties among university centers of the world.

WSSF is financed solely by contributions from students and professors at the prep school and university level. Its projects, going to Southeast Asia, Europe, and China are based only on need of the recipients.

As traveling secretary for WSSF, John Cole, points out, world student relief is a subcommittee of the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization—UNESCO. It is the university students' voice in the U. N.

"Don't Pass the Buck—Give it" is the theme of the campus campaign Apr. 3-7, only officially-sponsored ASUO drive of the year. At that time students may join strength to accomplish a worthwhile goal together.

"This is our chance to put the University of Oregon on the world map and help us all realize that

we are a part of the world university community," Willy Dodds, chairman of the U. O. appeal, emphasized.

Four sub chairmen of the WSSF special events committee were announced Monday by Chairman Bill Carey.

They are Tom Barry, auction; John Epley, parade; Don Hanel, contest; and Bill DeLand, specialty advertising.

Purpose of the special events committee will be to promote interest in the all campus drive which will be held Apr. 3-7.

University Officials Attend Conference

Five University officials attended the Friday meeting of the Pacific Coast Board of Intergovernmental Relations in Portland.

From the Bureau of Municipal Research were Herman Kerhli, director; A. M. Westling, planning consultant; Deane Seeger, consultant of the League of Oregon Cities; Alfred C. Shepard, assistant director from the Portland office, and Vincent Ostrum, professor of political science.

Mayor of Eugene, V. Edwin Johnson, and Finance Officer Henry Beistel also attended the conference.

Registration Ends With 4591 Total

"We estimate that 1324 undergraduate students have finished registration during the pre-registration period," reports Clifford Constance, Registrar.

Constance estimates the number of students who finished step "5," but did not pay their fees, as 4591.

"This means," he said, "that all but about 200 undergraduates completed the necessary registration steps."

Constance believes that this estimate indicates students have found the registration system workable. He says he noted a near-absence of lines which is a further indication that the present system is satisfactory.
