CCNY, Arizona, Niagara Selected For National Invitation Tournament

Trojans, Yale, MSC, Schedule Meet in April

LOS ANGELES — (UP) — University of Southern California announced Monday it will hold a triangular track and field meet here against Michigan State and Yale April 29.

Although Southern California met Michigan State last year, it will be the first meeting with Yale for the Trojans.

Southern California and Michigan State tied 61 to 61 last spring.

The meet will be held in Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum, Trojan Athletic Director Willis O. Hunter announced.

NEW YORK—UP—Arizona City College of New York and Niagara were selected today to complete the 12-team field in the National Invitational Basketball tournament which begins at Madison Square Garden here Saturday.

Of the trio picked, only Arizona came as a major surprise.

The Border Conference champions, who have won 25 games and lost four this season, were considered pretty much NCAA tournament property, since they are highly eligible for the Southwest berth CCNY was picked with a 16-5 record and Niagara with 20-6.

These latest selections joined Bradley, Duquesne, St. John, LaSalle, Syracuse, Long Island University, Western Kentucky, San Francisco, and Kentucky in the Madison Square Garden classic.

The complete pairings for the tournament's opening round will be announced today. Four seeded teams will draw byes. The other four compete in two doubleheader sessions, on Saturday afternoon and the other Saturday night.

The quarterfinals will be played in doubleheaders Monday and Tuesday nights, the semifinals Thursday and the finals Saturday, March 13.

Preliminary ¼-mile run—5:05 on the Frosh football field.

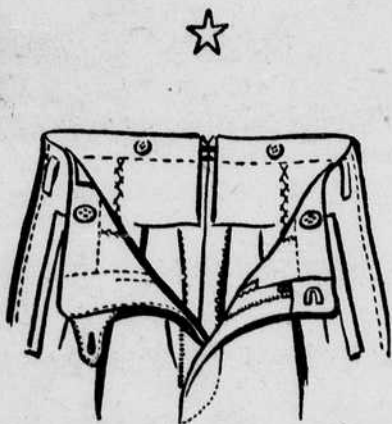
All field event preliminaries will be held at 4 p.m. at Hayward Field.

The all-school intramural track finals are scheduled Thursday afternoon. Bowerman will distribute a schedule for the finals to all organization representatives.

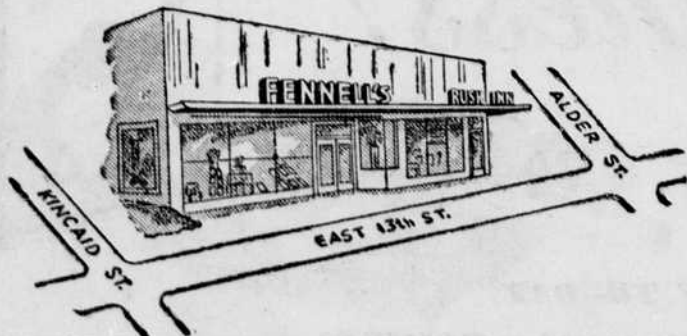

National Basketball Ratings

Holy Cross's first defeat of the season dropped the Crusaders out of first place for the first time in seven weeks and enabled the Bradley Braves to advance to the top rung in this week's ratings.

The Braves, who will participate in the National Invitational tournament and perhaps the NCCA as well, stretched their winning streak to an even dozen and hiked their record to 27 triumphs out of 30 starts as they edged Tulsa, 57-56, and crushed Drake, 92-63.

Lodged in second place were the LaSalle Explorers, whose 19-3 slate includes wins over such teams as Western Kentucky, North Carolina State, and Cincinnati. The Explorers whipped Gettysburg by a 61-50 count last week, and, were selected to play in the Invitational meet.

Ohio State's District 4 NCAA representatives blasted Michigan, 69-58, to take over the number three slot. The Buckeyes boast a 19-3 ledger.

Another Invitational squad, the Kentucky Wildcats, finished their season with a 25-4 record after winning the South-eastern conference tournament. They downed Mississippi State, 56-46, rolled over Georgia, 79-63, and then slaughtered Tennessee, 95-58, in the finals.

The ex-leaders of the rankings, Holy Cross, bounced Valparaiso, 84-52, but skidded down to fifth following a close 58-56 win over New York AC and a 61-54 loss at the hands of Columbia, their first

of the year. The Crusaders have 26 conquests.

Western Kentucky (24-5) was idle during the week, having completed its schedule, but was chosen to play in the Invitational. They were followed by the St. John's Redmen (22-4), who routed St. Peter's by a 105-61 score, and who were also picked for the Invitational.

Up a notch to eighth came North Carolina State, which captured its fourth consecutive Southern conference tournament triumph. The Wolfpack (24-5), slated to represent District 3 in the NCAA playoffs, walloped Virginia Tech, 67-42, trimmed Wake Forrest, 59-53, and smashed Duke in the finals by a 67-47 margin.

Biggest drop of the week was registered by Duquesne, which was added to the Invitational line-up, when the Dukes, beaten only once previously, dropped two straight contests to give them a 23-3 record. They were upset by Akron, 51-49, and Baldwin Wallace, 62-55.

The Long Island U. Blackbirds, another of the teams entered in the Invitational, moved back into the top ten by chalking up a 63-52 decision over strong Hamline. Earlier they had broken the school record by burying John Carroll under a 119-82 count as big Sherman White racked up 63 points. The Blackbirds finished the season with a 20-4 slate.

Although only one more week of the regular season remains, there

are still several important games on the schedule. These include LaSalle at Boston College, Georgetown at Villanova, CCNY-NYU, Duquesne at Villanova, Holy Cross at Yale, and Muhlenberg at LaSalle.
