Positions Open In WAC, WAF

Increasing opportunities are available for college women as officers in the WAC and WAF, according to Master Sgt. Virginia Gibson, recruiting officer for the Eugene district.

Sgt. Gibson and Lt. Marcellette Hall, district recruiting officers for the Pacific Northwest, visited Hendricks Hall last month to explain opportunities in the armed services.

Candidates for the WAC officer candidate schools must be from 19-20 years of age, have two years of college education, be single with no dependents, a U. S. citizen, and in excellent physical condition.

WAF requirements differ only in the age qualification. Candidates must be from 20½ to 26½ years old.

The WAC officers candidate school is located at Camp Lee, Va., the WAF school at Lakeland, Fla. Both schools offer a ten-month training period. WAC candidates train an additional four months at San Antonio, Tex.

Interested applicants may apply to Sgt. Gibson's office, Room 10, Post Office Building, Eugene.
