New Jobs Available Says Civil Service Man

"Job opportunities are constantly opening up, although on a long range basis," James M. Clinton, acting director of the Oregon civil service, told students Thursday. Approximately 65 students assembled in room 3 Fenton to discuss civil service employment with a group of state representatives headed by Clinton.

Clinton emphasized the need for immediate application.

"You might not be hired for six months or a year, but with the present surplus of candidates you must apply now," he said.

Some positions in specialized fields are available now, he reported. He also mentioned summer work in the highway, forestry, and agriculture departments which will be open in the next few months.

George Robinson, chief examiner, described the advantages of the exam system. "Take the exam even if it does not assure you of a position," he said.

Both Clinton and Robinson stated that state salaries are comparable to those in private industry.

State representatives participating in the conference included Adam Lafor, division of adults; Gordon Shattuck, unemployment compensation commission; A. T. Johnson, state board of health, and Miss Margaret White, state public welfare commission.

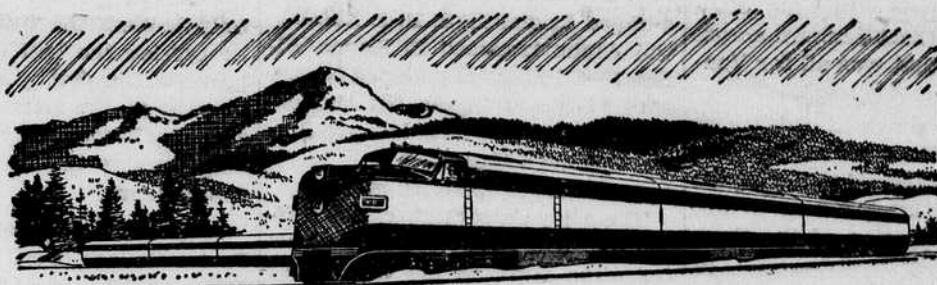
