A \$350 scholarship will be given to a woman who will be a junior here next year, and a \$250 scholarship will be given to a senior woman.

Application blanks for the scholarships—open to all women who will be juniors or seniors next year—may be obtained at the Office of Student Affairs, 201 Emerald Hall. Deadline for their return is Apr. 22. Presentation will be made at the All-campus Sing during Junior Weekend.

Selection will be made by a committee of faculty members and members of Tri-Delta. Last year Anita Holmes received the \$350 scholarship and Rose Seid the \$250 award.

Fifty cents an hour is the rate Tri-Deltas charge for their baby-sitting services, and each girl is required to contribute at least \$10 to the scholarship fund.
