"Anyone can petition to run for an ASUO office under the new constitution; he does not have to be put up by a political party," the president stated.

Elections will be held under the preferential system, with the two candidates polling the highest number of votes being named president and vice-president and the next nine candidates being named Senate members-at-large, according to

the proposed constitution.

"A closer tie will be formed between student government and the Co-op and Student Union Boards and other committees," Johnson said.

Chairman of the Co-op and Union Boards will be members of the President's cabinet under the new setup.
