

Krause Hurls in Opener Against Idaho Today; Johnson on Tomorrow

It will be Mel Krause today, and DeWayne Johnson tomorrow, as Oregon shoots the works against Idaho, in the first two games of their Inland Empire trip.

Facing the prospect of its first cellar birth since before 1930, Oregon will lead with its aces against Idaho, go with the rest of the staff against Washington State, and come back with Krause and Johnson against the Washington Huskies in a pair of games next week.

Fresh from a pair of victories against Oregon State, Idaho has designs upon second place. The Beavers went up to Moscow with a three won, one lost, mark. After a two game drubbing, they moved over to Pullman and showed little sign of their old spark. The same thing could happen to Oregon if they have a bad series against the Vandals.

Coach Don Kirsch is counting on no worse than an even split in his six game road trip. He sacrificed the fine fielding "Mouse" Owens in order to make the 17th man on his traveling squad a pitcher. Should Oregon take the first two against Idaho, Kirsch will have four pitchers, Sid Mills, Jim Hanns, Lyle Rogers, and Gene Rose to throw against Washington State.

Idaho, is just beginning to play good baseball. Among their stars is Tobe Massingill, hard hitting second baseman, who led the batting attack against Oregon State. Tobe sports a .333 batting mark against Oregon, with two of his three hits going for extra bases.

Local fans will also remember Joe Zavetsky, the Vandal third baseman. Joe is the boy who hit the first home run of the year at Howe field. He proved that it was no fluke by coming back the next afternoon and banging another. His first was hit off today's foe, Mel Krause.

Ozzie Knickerberg, Idaho's star pitcher is due to see action in one of the Oregon games. He sports one victory over the Beavers, and would like to keep being the thorn in the Oregon nest. Another Vandal who awaits Oregon with pleasure is big Nick Stallworth, who hit five for ten at Howe field.

440 Relay Race Saturday Stars Ducks vs Ducks

A special treat will be in store for fans who attend the Oregon-Washington track meet on Hayward Field this Saturday.

Oregon's now-famous quarter-mile relay team will race Saturday. The quartet of Al Bullier, Jack Smith, Dave Henthorne, and Bill Fell will run against another four-some of Ducks before the running events of the regular Washington meet get underway.

The other team, to be composed of Jack Countryman, Phi Jones, Mitch Cleary, and Woodley Lewis will be given a head start of 10 yards in the race, set for 1:45 p.m. Saturday.

Bowerman said he is holding the special 440-yard relay event because many fans have expressed a desire to see the Duck relay squad, which finished second last week in the national Drake Relays. The relay team will not compete on Hayward Field again this year, so far as the mentor knows now.

The Washington meet will begin with field events at 1:30 p.m. and the regular dual running events will go under the gun at 2 p.m., with the start of the mile race.

Duck Team High on Coast

With its record of second place in the Drake Relays, the Webfoot quarter-mile relay team is rated as one of the best on the coast.

Athletic department sources said yesterday Washington's Coach, Hec Edmundson, is unable to enter a 440 relay team because of lack of depth in his sprint department.

For that reason, fans will be treated to the special race, with the underdog team getting the 10 yard head start.

A 440-yard relay race is not part of a regular Northern Division Dual meet, so the Huskies will be losing no points by not entering a team.

In the race, Countryman will run against Bullier, number two men will be Jones and Smith, Cleary and Henthorne will take the third stride, and Lewis will anchor against the rapid Fell.

The Ducks battle the College of Puget Sound at Eugene Friday, and the crucial Oregon-Washington clash, which probably will determine the dual meet title, will take place at Eugene on Saturday.

Washington State moved out of the Northern Division basement last Friday by edging the Oregon State Beavers 14-13 at Pullman.

On the following day, the Beavers defeated Idaho at Moscow, leaving the Vandals in the cellar. Oregon State is now tied with WSC for third place.

Beaver Tennis Squad Trims Oregon, 6-1; OSC JVs Win, 5-2

The powerful Oregon State College varsity and junior varsity tennis squads lived up to their favorites' roles when they shellacked the Oregon varsity and JV teams by wide margins at Corvallis yesterday.

The Beaver varsity turned on the heat for a 6-1 blasting of the Webfoots, while the baby Beavers smashed the Ducks' second varsity by a 5-2 count.

Tom Macdonald was the only Duck able to capture a match for the varsity, while Jerry Barde and Martin Meadows registered the only triumphs for the Webfoot JVs.

The match was the sixth straight decision for the unbeaten OSC crew and gave them a 3-0 record in conference play. Coach Irwin Harris' netters will be tough to beat in the run for the title, from the results of yesterday's encounter.

Macdonald Wins Two Straight

In the number one singles contest, Macdonald and OSC's Wes Brigham hooked up in what was supposed to have been a close match, but Macdonald routed his foe by scores of 6-1, 6-2.

The Beavers swept the remaining games as follows:

Bill Husted eased by Cameron Thom, 6-4, 6-3, in two close sets; Don Megale came from behind to notch a three-set 4-6, 6-0, 6-3 victory over Dan Cudahy; George Allison tripped Bob Mensor, 6-1, 6-4; and Ray Thornton squeezed out a 6-4, 6-4 win over Bill Williams.

In doubles, Brigham and Husted bounced Macdonald and Cudahy, 6-2, 6-2, and Megale and Thornton eked out a 6-4, 8-6 conquest over Thom and Williams.

The JV match saw the Beavers cop three of five singles and both doubles for their 5-2 margin.

Meadows Wins

Barde turned in one of the two Duck wins as he subdued Trostel Werth, 6-3, 6-4, in the top singles game.

Meadows accounted for the other when he wiped out a 3-5 deficit in the second set and went on to rack up a 6-3, 8-6 decision over Bert O'Neil.

For the Beavers, Dick Russell subdued Fred Zolezzi, 6-3, 6-3; Tom Jacobson thrashed Merv Englund, 6-1, 6-0; and Dave Hasle topped Herb Chin, 6-2, 6-2.

Doubles play saw Werth and Russell, pull out a 7-5, 6-4 triumph from Barde and Zolezi, while Jacobson and Hasle laced Englund and Chin, 6-1, 6-4.

Cotton Bowl Club Game Set Firm for May 12

The Duck-Cotton Bowl Club game is definitely set to go. Kick-off date is Friday, May 12.

Bob Roberts, former Oregon tackle, has indicated that the game will be far from a simple publicity stunt.

Roberts says his club will practice every day from now until game time. The contest has been approved by Pacific Coast Conference Commissioner Vic Schmidt, and Athletic Director Leo Harris has given the club complete use of McArthur Court dressing room facilities and practice field.

Officially, the group calls itself the Oregon Cotton Bowl Club. President of the club is Dan Garza; secretary, Norm Yatchmenoff; coaches, Norm Van Brocklin and Les Hagen; and Keith DeCorcey is in charge of game arrangements.

According to his latest release, Roberts says the team will be stressing offense, with Van Brocklin tossing passes to Dick Wilkins, Garza, and Darrell Robinson.

The Club's line-up will be limited by a ruling which has been set up for the game. The only restrictions on line-up are that only players who are registered in school or who are members of Jim Aiken's coaching staff may participate in the game.

This will shorten the line-up somewhat, but Aiken has promised some extra men for the Cotton Bowl Clubbers. The date of the game, incidentally, puts it the Friday of Junior Weekend.
