Yeats' Poetry New Art Form Professor States

The poetry of William Butler Yeats is a new art form governed by new rules of expression. If people can't understand, it is because they are still going by the old rules.

This was the opinion of Hoyt Trowbridge, professor of English, in his discussion of Yeats' poetry in the Library Browsing Room Wednesday night.

Characterizing Yeats as having "as fine a lyric gift as Tennyson, Shelley or Keats," Prof. Trowbridge said that in understanding Yeats "people are still at the mercy of their own ignorance."

Discussing the involved symbolism of the writer, Prof. Trowbridge said that in the best of Yeats' poems, the poet used words of common meanings and enhanced them by his interpretation.

"In most cases the reader will find Yeats fairly easy to follow if he is willing to accept this metaphorical language," Prof. Trowbridge continued.

The lecturer explained that the poet's dependence on symbolism stemmed from Yeats' belief that the ideal truth is discernible only through imaginative symbols.

In his discussion, Prof. Trowbridge divided the poet's work into three periods.

In his youthful period Yeats was hampered by an artificial and unconvincing style, Prof. Trowbridge said. His middle period showed a comprehension of the common idiom as the real language of poetry.

The final period was one of ripening skill and a deepening understanding of his vehicle.

Prof. Trowbridge read several selections from Yeats' poetry during his lecture.

The speaker was introduced by Carl W. Hintz, librarian, and discussion following the talk was led by Ernest G. Moll, professor of English.

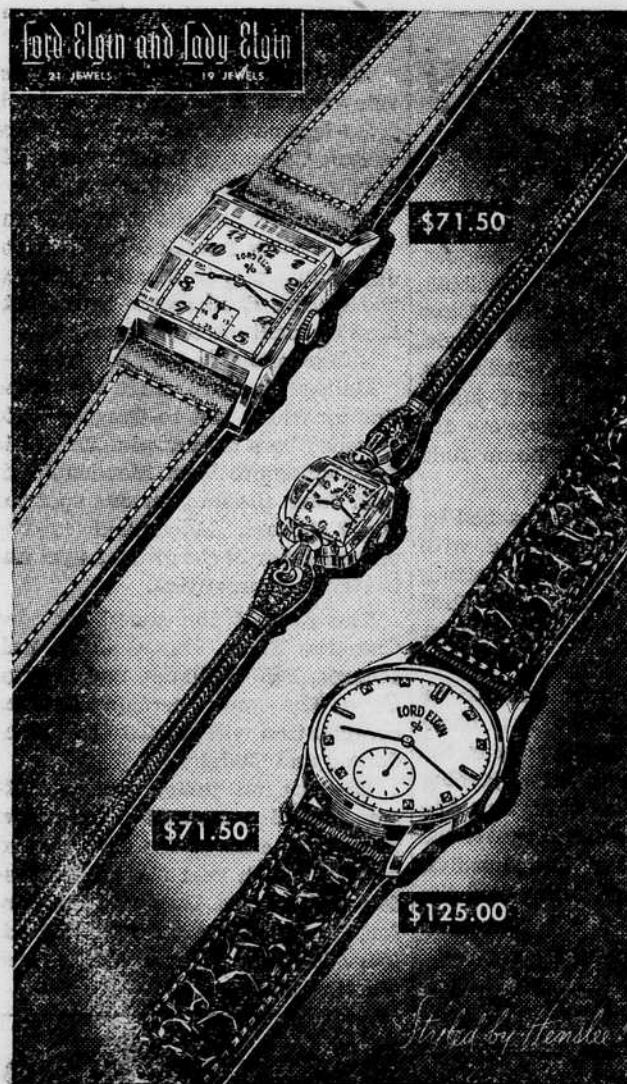
