Eugene High school will furnish opposition for the Yearlings Saturday point to a tight struggle for mond. The Axemen are the only squad to have tripped the Oregons this season, and that was a convincing 9-3 hitfest about three weeks ago.

Vandals Top Ducks In Second Tilt, 9-7, WSC Game Today

The roof fell in on Oregon yesterday, and the plate disappeared for DeWayne Johnson, as Idaho topped the Ducks 9-7 at Moscow. Washington State faces the Webfoots today at Pullman.

Giving his wildest exhibition, in a season where he has shown little control, Johnson walked 10 men in 2 and 1/3 innings. In the first inning, he loaded the bases, and gave up three runs via bases on balls. The Vandals picked up two more tallies in the second, largely because of the lefthander's inability to find the strike zone.

Joe Zavetsky's single in the second was the only hit during the five run parade, and it did not score a run.

Oregon picked up two tallies in the second, and from then on seemed to be under the control of Vandal pitcher Bob Pritchett. Idaho tallied three more in the third off the offerings of Lyle Rogers.

With two out in the eighth, singles by Daryle Nelson, Don Kimball, and Joe Sugura, plus two Idaho errors and a couple of walks, got Oregon five runs.

Idaho moved into third place, several percentage points over the idle Oregon Staters. Oregon remains in the league basement.

The Oregon junior varsity netmen will also see action tomorrow when they engage the OSC second varsity, which beat them 5-2 Tuesday at Corvallis. Ducks due to perform are Jerry Barde, Fred Zolezzi, Merv Englund, Herb Chin, and Martin Meadows.

Aiken, McLure Leave for UCLA Spring Game

Coaches Jim Aiken and Buster McClure will head south today to scout UCLA's spring football game, set for tomorrow in Los Angeles.

Aiken said yesterday that Oregon's spring contest on May 20 will be viewed by two scouts from the Bruin school. He was informed of this, he added, by head UCLA Coach Red Saunders.

Due to the heavy rain yesterday afternoon, the head mentor gave his team no practice. He has used 20 of his allotment of 30 spring practice sessions. Jim asserted that he will run through five practices next week and five the week after that, topping off the spring season with the intra-squad game May 20.

Huskies Here Saturday For Duck Track Battle

Coach Bill Bowerman's Oregon track and field stars will face the University of Washington Huskies Saturday at 1:30 p.m. on Hayward Field. It will be final home meet for the Ducks this season.

It will also be final home appearance of seven Webfoot seniors. George Rasmussen, Don Pickens, and Lloyd Hickok, vaulters, Dave Henthorne, sprinter, Jack Doyle, hurdler, Pete Mundle, distances, and Woodley Lewis, broad jumping sprinter, all will compete for the last time on their home field Saturday.

The visiting Huskies, coached by Hec Edmundson, are loaded with plenty of talent capable of setting the Ducks down with their first dual meet defeat of the current season.

First place winners look to be evenly divided by the two clubs with Oregon having the edge in the vault, 100, 220, 440, mile, javelin, and discus. Washington has the bulge in the remaining events, the shot put, high jump, both hurdles, 880-yard run, broad jump, and the two-mile run.

Oregon Rich In Depth

However, first place victories alone will not win the meet, and it's Oregon's tremendous depth strength in almost every event that will cast them in the favored role when the opposing teams face the starter's gun Saturday. Another thing in favor of Bill Bowerman's crew is where it has the advantage in an event that margin almost hedges on dominance of first and second place, while some of the Huskies' events could turn into upsets in favor of Oregon. This is particularly true of the broad jump where Woodley Lewis, ND broad jump king last year, will be fighting to regain his title.

Washington's Don Bartholmey has the best jump between the two so far this year. He leaped 22 feet 11 1/2 inches last week against Idaho and California, but Lewis' best this year is only 1 1/2 inches shorter.

of Puget Sound for a non-conference clash at the local course today if weather conditions are satisfactory.

Oregon and Washington are tied for the most dual meet titles ever won by one school, and Saturday's winner will take the lead in the all-time standings. Each school has won the crown seven times.

The Ducks hold victories over Oregon State, Washington State, and Idaho, while the Huskies have taken their only win of the season from WSC.

Oregon's last triumph over the Huskies was in 1947, when the undefeated Ducks defeated Washington 15 1/2 - 11 1/2 in the season's opener.

Washington gained revenge by taking an identical 15 1/2 - 11 1/2 win over Oregon in 1948, and the Huskies gained an 18 1/2 - 8 1/2 victory last spring.

The College of Puget Sound edged a strong Oregon team 15 1/2 - 11 1/2 last year, and today's meet might also be a close one.

The Oregon Frosh, also undefeated, will stage a dual meet with the Oregon State Rooks at Eugene on Saturday, May 13. This will be the second battle of the season for the Frosh, who crushed the Rooks 11-7 at Corvallis last Saturday.
