

Civil Service Job Exams Available

Examinations for the positions of librarian, library assistant, and inspector, in clearing, sub-station or line construction, have been announced by the Federal Civil Service.

Library appointments pay up to \$3100 per year and are available in the Pacific Northwest.

Inspector positions pay from \$3450 to \$3825 per year, in Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Western Montana.

Further information and application forms may be obtained from the Director, Eleventh U. S., Civil Service Region, 302 Federal Office Building, Seattle 4, Wash.

Applications for Library positions must be on file with the Director by May 22.

Applications for the position of Inspector may be filed with the Board of U.S., Civil Service Examiners, Bonneville Power Administration, P.O. Box 3537, Portland 8, Ore., not later than May 31.

Vu-graph to Aid During Lectures

It's called a Vu-graph.

It's a new machine, purchased recently by the audio-visual department, designed to aid professors in presenting everything from slides to chemistry formulas.

The Vu-graph has a flat surface for placing slides up to five by seven inches, or for writing formulas, working out math problems, drawing diagrams, and making outlines. The image is projected onto the wall behind the speaker, so that he may face the class as he talks.

Available to all departments, the machine is capable of creating images up to six and one-half feet, depending on the distance from the reflecting surface. Clearer pictures are attained in a dark room, but the Vu-graph is also suited to a light location.

Eiserer Speaks To Educators

Paul E. Eiserer, professor of education and psychology, addressed a sectional meeting on "Teacher Anxiety and Pupil Learning" at the annual Oregon Conference on Elementary Education in Monmouth Saturday.

Nearly 1,000 educators and school administrators attended the sessions at the Oregon College of Education. H. M. Gunn, OCE president, was conference host. Main speaker was Dr. Henry J. Otto, University of Texas curriculum and administration expert.

Among those attending the conference were Rex Putnam, superintendent of public instruction and R. G. Langston, University professor of education who was recently named president of Eastern Oregon College of Education.
