

## Oregana Picks Upper Staff

Upper staff appointments on the 1951 Oregana, which goes on sale during registration this week, were announced Tuesday by Editor Ruth Landry and Business Manager Bob Schooling.

Associate editors will be Kathy Littlefield, layout; Bob Funk, copy; and Pat Mullen, houses. These three appointments are subject to the approval of the Publications Board.

Art editor will be Bonnie Birke-meier.

Yearbooks will be sold on the partial payment plan again this year, with two \$3 payments taking the place of the three \$2 payments, Schooling explained. Students may also pay the full \$6 immediately.

On the business staff, Paul Patterson will be advertising manager; Jane Weber, executive secretary; and Bob Haugaard, promotion. Publicity director for both

editorial and business staffs is Gretchen Grondahl.

Explaining the partial payment plan, now going into its second year, Schooling said that students may pay \$3 at registration now and the other \$3 winter term.

This year's edition will be about the same size as the 1950 book—around 400 pages—the editor predicted. She plans to have about the same amount of color, possibly more.

Open house for students who wish to work on the 1951 Oregana will be scheduled sometime next week, Miss Landry said. New students will be especially welcome, she stated.

## Theater Positions Open to Applicants

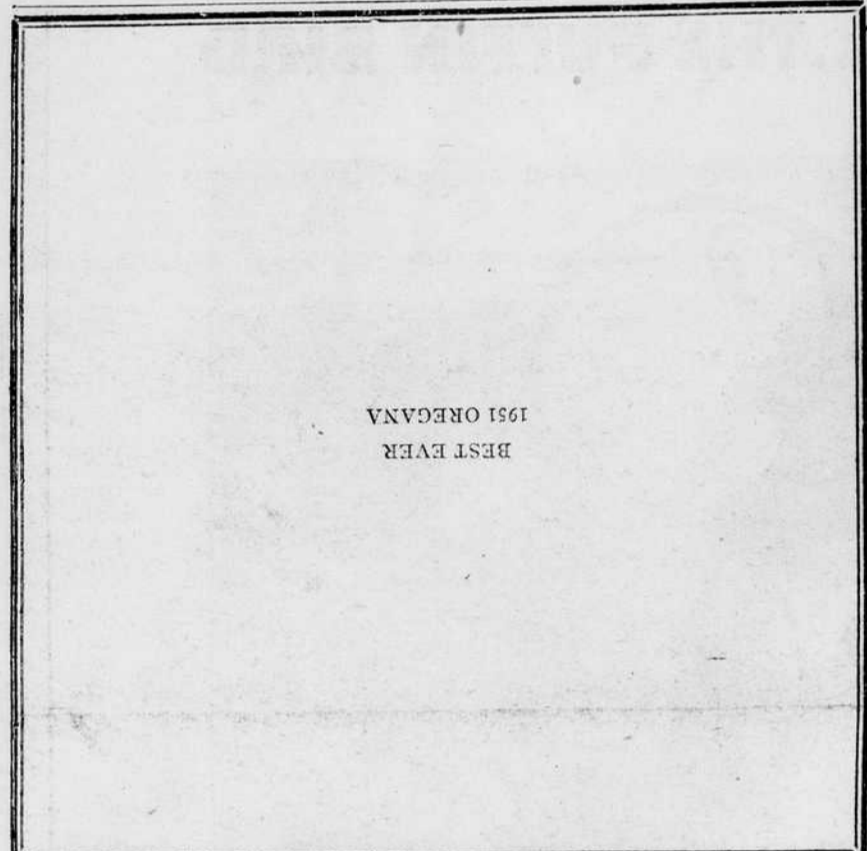
Application for University Theater student positions are now being accepted by Virginia Hall, theater business manager, at the theater box office.
