## Student Affairs Office Lists Rules

(The following rules, regulations, and procedures govern social life at the University, of Oregon. They were formulated by the Student Affairs Committee, which has, authority over all student affairs and is particularly concerned with the, prevention of interference with students' scholastic.work.)
I. General Policies of the Student Affairs Commitiee
A. The Student Affairs Committee authorizes its chairman, the Director of Men's Affairs and/or the Director of Women's Affairs to implement and administer the general policies and business of this decisions concerning matters which do not seem important enough to bring before the full committee.
B. The Director of Men's Affairs, the Director of Women's Affairs, and the Student Unjon Director may revise specific dates appearing on the yearly social calendar, approved by this committee, provided that such ch
C. Every social event must be registered in the office of the Director of Women's Affairs not later than 5:00 p.m. of the Monday preceding the event except that stag. aff the Director of Men's Affairs.
. The closed period for all events is from 5:00 p.m. of the third day nation period.
E. The Student Affairs Committee recognizes the need and desirability for proper and accurate accounting, of all student funds. Accord-
ingly, it urges all student organizations to deposit their funds with ingly, it urges, all student Union Office to insure safe-keeping snd proper accounting of income, and expenses. This service is offered without charge to all organizations.

A. Closing hours are: $10: 30$ p.m. Sunday through Thursday, $12: 15 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$.

I. Social Life of Living Organizations:
A. Living organizations may have two major house dances a year. or in a University-c.ontrolled, building. They may be held on Saturday nights, only.
B. Informal house functions, such as firesides, radio or dinner dances, are restricted to Friday or Saturday nights. No time must be cons. Housed in preparation for these events

alumni, privileges to be withdrawn if these regulations are violated.

1. Minor all-campus dances of a rally nature may be held on occa sions when desirable, under the following conditions:
a. Normally, the dance must be held on Saturday night
c. The administration of thëse dances lies with the Student Union Director.
I. Rallies, Serenades, Parades:
A. The administration of rallies and parades is the responsibility
the Director of Men's Afairs. Such events:
2. Must be scheduled 24 hours in advance.
3. Must not conflict with class hours or normal study hours.
4. Must not conflict with class $h$.

B. Organized serenades are allowed on Friday and Saturday nights. Such serenades:

1. Must terminate within one hour after normal closing hours.
2. Must be cleared with the Director of Men's Affairs 24 hours in advance.
VII. Off-Campus Dance:

B. All dances sponsored by living organizations in the Eugene area must be held in the organizations' living quarters or in a University controlled building.

## III. Chaperonage:

A. Official chaperones shall be limited to members of the faculty
chaperones that will be adequate for social affairs.
C. A chaperonage fee of $\$ 5.00$ must be paid to the Unive
cashier for each social function, unless the fee is waived by the Director of Women's Affairs.
. Rally Committee:
A. It is the duty of the Rally Committee to promote Oregon spirit,
foster good sportsmanship, and arrange for all rallies both foster good sportsmanship, and arrange for all rallies, both on
and off the campus, and to assist the yell leader if called upon to do so in performing card stunts and other forms of entertainment prepared for athletic events.
X. Charters: Th
A. Local: Individuals wishing to start a local organization must submit, for approval by the Student Affairs Committee, its constitution and by-laws and the signatures of inter ested persons.
B. National: Local organizations wishing to affiliate with a national organization must present, for approval by the student Affairs Committee, the name of the national, the loca national, etc.
I. Recognition of Organizations
A. All student organizations must be recognized and sanctioned (given authoritative permission to exist and carry on their actiwithdraw recognition from any organization at any time.
B. The committee recognizes two classes of organizations:

1. Class I.
a. Those which purport to represent the University in any way.
b. Those which bear the name of the University.
c. Those which influence the well-being of the University by their public contacts.
2. Class II.
a. The committee may, at its discretion, recognize the existence of other organizations, if their aims are consistent with the
well-being of the University and with the policies of this well-beitg of the will not permit them to bear the name of the University or to use the name of the University in connection with their activities or to represent the University in any way. They are subject to the same rules, regulations,
procedures as organizations officially recognized.
