Around 16,000 persons had been served by the Student Union soda fountain by 5 p. m. Thursday, Miss Ruth Coffey, foods director, reported to the Student Union Board at their Thursday meeting.

Students are served between 1,200 and 1,500 cups of coffee and 45 dozen doughnuts each day, she estimated. Cafeteria line figures show 225 persons served Thursday noon.
