Placement Office Aids Graduates

Around 900 students from last spring's graduating class were placed through the graduate placement office, according to Karl W. Onthank, director, and all now have employment.

The jobs they got as a result of interviews arranged by the placement office range in pay from \$150 to \$600 a month, with Onthank's estimate of the average being between \$250 to \$275.

Typical of the jobs several graduates are now engaged in include accounting, selling, and interior decorating for the men while several women have jobs as air line stewardesses.
