

Open-Shelf Plan Assists Students

Most students seem to be able to find the books that they want when using the open-shelf system, George F. Jones, head of the University Library's circulation department, said Thursday after the first day of operation under the new plan.

The library's new annex, which also opened Thursday, is an important part of the increased service to students, Jones said. It allows for more study space and increases floor space by about 80 percent.

Any students who are having trouble locating books are advised by Jones to pick up a copy of the information leaflet, a guide to the University Library, telling how and where books are arranged. The staff is also willing to answer any questions that may arise, he said.

It is important that students check books out at the circulation desk before they take them home or to other parts of the building, Jones pointed out.

Professor Finds Europe Friendly To United States

"People in Europe think most highly of the United States, and we were treated splendidly in every city and small town into which we went," was the statement made by N. H. Comish, professor of Business Administration, concerning his recent trip to Europe.

Leaving Eugene June 6, Comish and his wife spent three months in Europe, returning home Sept. 3.

On their tour they visited parks, palaces, art galleries, castles and gardens in Denmark, Sweden, Scotland, West Germany, England, Belgium and Holland. They visited the parliaments in some countries, cathedrals, and also included an opera in Paris and a Shakespeare play in London.

The trip was planned for pleasure, but Comish contacted business and department executives, and observed merchandising practices. Wholesale institutions and produce markets, primarily those in Sweden, Denmark and England were co-operatives, he said, while most others visited were private concerns.

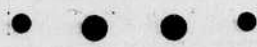
