The major passing chores will be handled by Spreen, who completed three of four aeriels for two touchdowns in the Willamette clash last Friday. Spreen's tosses accounted for 84 yards, or an average of 21 yards for every pass attempt.

Hostetler was the leading ground gainer in the Willamette game. He gained 61 yards in 9 tries, averaging 6.8 yards per try. Reserve Halfback Jim Gunnell also was outstanding as he gained 53 yards in 5 attempts for a 10.6 average.
