Seniors, Grad Students Eligible To Compete for Rotary Awards

Application for Rotary Fellowships for advanced study in foreign nations should be submitted to the Eugene Rotary Club early in November.

These fellowships are again being offered only to seniors and graduate students.

Funds sufficient to provide for the student's traveling expenses, registration fees, book and tuition costs, room and board, and educational travel within the foreign country are included in the fellowships.

Fellows are selected equally on character, leadership, scholarship,

and service qualities. To apply a student must have received a bachelor's degree, or be in his senior year expecting to receive the degree at the end of the academic year. The candidates must be between 20 and 28 years old.

Applications will be narrowed down by a series of regional committees. Final selection of fellows will be made by the Rotary Foundation Fellowships Committee and will be announced in January.

Last year there were 195 Rotary fellows studying in 96 universities and 27 countries.

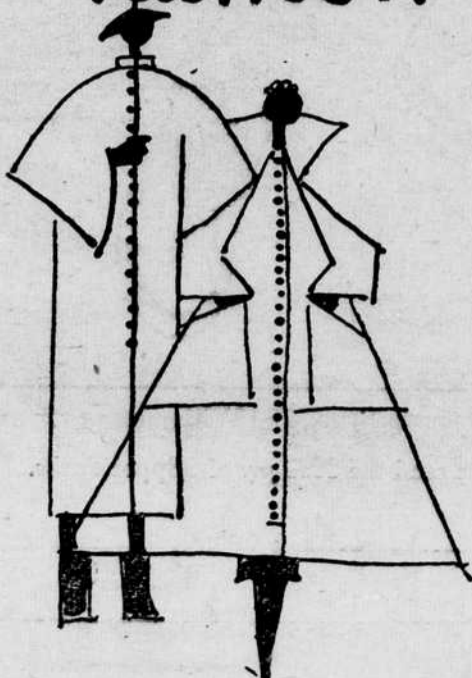
