Radio Studios To Record 'Sing'

"Let's Sing America" will be a feature of the community sing to be held at 7:45 p.m. Wednesday in the Student Union Ballroom. It will be second in a series of eight radio shows rebroadcast by the experimental program of the university radio studios under its "Experiment. . . Radio."

Don Porter, KUGN announcer, will act as master of ceremonies. Solo parts during the "everybody sing" will be handled by Joy Grinstead and Lorin Miller, while Maude Garnett, associate professor of public school music, will be song leader. Organ music will be provided by Zonda Montgomery, instructor of music at Willamette High School.

The purpose of the "Experiment. . . Radio" series is to "create new types of radio broadcasts or to revive old shows," co-producer Jack Vaughn said Monday.

"The whole series is being recorded for later release over station KOAC, and more important, to be made available to all university radio stations across the nation as representative of what the University of Oregon studio's do," Vaughn remarked.

The program is open to both students and townspeople. Admission is free.

Metzler Wins Fee Scholarship

Kenneth Metzler, senior in journalism, has been chosen winner of a fee scholarship awarded annually by the Eugene chapter of the American Newspaper Guild, Gordon A. Sabine, dean of the School of Journalism, announced Thursday.

Metzler, an associate editor of the Emerald, was unanimously chosen by a joint committee of the Guild and School of Journalism. The scholarship, amounting to \$132, was awarded on the basis of three items—aptitude for the field, financial need, and scholastic standing—in that order.

Now attending the Miami Beach, Fla. national convention of Sigma Delta Chi, men's professional journalism fraternity, Metzler will be graduated at the end of summer session, 1951. He has worked his entire way through more than three years at the University. Last summer he was acting editor of the Medford News, a weekly, and reporter on the Roseburg News-Review, a daily.

His past activities on the Emerald have included jobs as reporter, assistant news editor, and news editor. Now vice-president of Sigma Delta Chi, Metzler was awarded the SDX award as the out-

standing sophomore worker on the Emerald two years ago.

With an overall grade point average of 2.68, Metzler has an average in journalism courses of 3.17.
