

Ducks, Utes Clash Tonight at Salt Lake

Reserve Cagers Mix with Frosh Today at Igloo

Coach Don Kirsch's Frosh basketball squad will scrimmage with the Oregon varsity reserves at 4 p.m. today in McArthur Court.

The Frosh will start today's scrimmage with Kenny Wegner and Bob Hawes at the guard positions, Doug Rogers at center, and John Reynolds and Ron Phillips as forwards.

Among the other Ducklings who probably will see action are Forwards Bob Stout and Don Siegmund, Center Leon Keefe, and Guards Paul Poetsch and Barney Holland.

Guards Dick Stearns, Gene Lewis, and Clark Hollis are also in line for probable action.

The Ducklings will open the season against the Portland University Frosh Tuesday. They will battle the Oregon State Rooks eight times during the season.

The Frosh will meet only three prep teams—Salem's state champions, Lebanon, and Eugene.

Washington, California Hog PCC Grid Statistics

LOS ANGELES—(P)—California's 1950 Rose Bowl team and runner-up Washington maintained their offensive leadership as the Pacific Coast Conference regular grid season statistics were written in the records Thursday.

California proved the finest rushing team and Washington dominated the air.

California, led by Johnny Olszewski, Pete Schabarum and Jimmy Monichino, amassed 2593 yards on the ground, with Washington, led 2076 yards.

Washington's Don Heinrich passed the Huskies 2041 yards, and Stanford was next, with Gary Kerkorian the chief thrower, with 1474 yards.

Washington led in total offense, with 4117 yards, and California was second with 3239 yards. UCLA was third with 2835 yards.

Defensively, California held opponents to 2237 yards in 10 games (1173 yards rushing, 1064 yards passing). UCLA was runner-up on total defense, allowing 2229 yards (1280 rushing, 949 passing) in nine games. Cal's average yield was 223.7 per game, UCLA's 247.6.

Bob Moore of UCLA put his school in front on punting. He averaged 41.1 yards and the school average was 41.3 yards.

It won't come as any surprise, but just for the record, the Conference also disclosed that eight circuit standards were smashed during the past season—Heinrich and McElhenny picking up six between them.

Bill McColl, Stanford end, did some record breaking of his own, catching 39 passes and gaining 671 yards. It bettered the 31 catches made by Ray Bauer of Montana and Darrell Robinson of Oregon last year.

Oregon's varsity basketball fortunes will be unveiled tonight at Salt Lake City when Coach John Warren's maple maulers open fire against a highly rated University of Utah quintet.

The Webfoots were scheduled to arrive at the Utah Capital city Thursday night in time for a light workout.

A twelve man contingent made the journey via the airways.

Hampered by the temporary loss of two highly touted cagers, Center Chet Noe and Forward Bob Peterson, the Ducks are expected to start three seniors and two juniors against the Utes.

The seniors are Guards Jack Keller and Mel Krause, and Forward Will Urban.

The third year men are Mel Streeter, forward, and Jim Loscut-off, center.

The starting Ute squad is well staffed, with four upperclassmen and a sophomore pivot man. The later is Ken Bates, a six-foot-five smoothie from Idaho Falls, Ida., who is the proud professor of an ambidextrous hook-shot.

Utah's potential All-American is a junior, Glenn Smith, who tallied 443 points last season.
