Campus Group Roscoe Pound Here Thursday Changes Name

A change of name for Oregon's Women's Athletic Association has been approved unanimously by the WAA cabinet.

The change will make it Women's Recreation Association, which is in line with a trend in other colleges and universities across the country.

WAA President Bonnie Gienger said the cabinet last week approved WRA, and the change had been under consideration since last spring. All members of the association will vote for or against the new name at women's all-campus elections in March.

If WRA is approved by a majority vote, it will become effective spring term.

Miss Gienger explained that the reason for the change is that the name Women's Recreation Association is more flexible, more inclusive, and covers a wider field than Women's Athletic Association.

The organization takes care of women's intramural sports, recreation nights, an annual carnival, and such clubs as Amphibians and the Outing Club. Approximately 250 members belong.

Roscoe Pound Here Thursday

Roscoe Pound, noted American jurist and university professor, will be on the university campus Thursday.

"What's Happened to the Law?" will be the title of his speech when he addresses students, faculty members, and Eugene townspeople at 8 p.m. Thursday in the Student Union Ballroom.

Among the books which he has written are "The Spirit of the Common Law," "Criminal Justice in America," "Interpretations of Legal History," "Introduction to the Philosophy of Law," and "Law and Morals."

His talk is part of the University Lecture Series being presented this year on the campus. The entire series will consist of eight

speeches with each lecturer talking in a field in which he is an expert.
