Former Instructor Perishes in Korea

Master Sgt. Bertram F. Emerson, University ROTC instructor from 1964 to 1948, was killed in action in Korea Aug. 12, according to word received at the University Tuesday.

Sgt. Emerson had previously been reported missing in action.

The former instructor was killed just as he reached the men under his command in the Fifth RCT with a fresh supply of ammunition.

He is survived by his sister, Miss Mary Emerson of New York City.
