while in India, Levering had the opportunity to talk with leaders in education and politics ineluding Prime Minister Nehru and President Prasad, as well as Vicechancellor Minjanath of Mysore University.

Levering was able to witness the refugee situation caused by religious strife and the starvation and political unrest which have made student problems acute.

Besides traveling in India and participating in study tours of most of the major cities there, Levering served as student body president of Redland College and worked with the Bonn Committee which has established one of the strongest inter-university affiliations within the WSSF program.

Jackie Wilkes, Oregon WSSF chairman, cited Levering as an excellent speaker and organizational expert for WSSF work. Miss Wilites also announced that the address Sunday is open to all students whether they belong to the church organization or not.
