Cerf to Discuss Style Changes In U.S. Humor

Bennett Cerf, next speaker in the University Assembly series, is known as a humorist, columnist, author, publisher, and anthologist.

Changing styles in American humor will be his subject when he speaks at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday in McArthur Court. The assembly will be open to students and townspeople, with no admission charge.

Cerf, who has written five best-selling collections of humorous stories, is president and founder of Random House Publishing Company.

He writes a weekly column, "Trade Winds," for the Saturday Review of Literature. The humorist's "Try and Stop Me" is widely syndicated.

A 1920 graduate in journalism from Columbia University, Cerf is a lifetime member of Phi Beta Kappa, national scholastic honorary.

His visit to the campus was arranged by the Assembly Committee. He is scheduled to speak in Portland Thursday.

The first University of Oregon newspaper was called the University of Oregon Monthly. During the first years of the new monthly it published news items of interest and provided a medium for literary contributions.
