Natural Areas Speech Topic

"The Protection of the Natural Areas in Oregon" will be the subject of Ruth E. Hopson, assistant professor of science in the General Extension Division, who will speak at 8 p.m. tonight in 207 Chapman Hall.

The talk, sponsored by the Natural History Study Society, a Eugene organization, is open to the public.

Dr. Hopson, emphasizing the scientific and scenic aspects of natural region in Oregon, will illustrate the talk with her own colored slides.

For the last three years, the speaker has been with the general extension division, teaching night classes throughout the state. She received the doctor's degree from Cornell, writing her thesis on McKenzie River region, "The Study of a Valley."

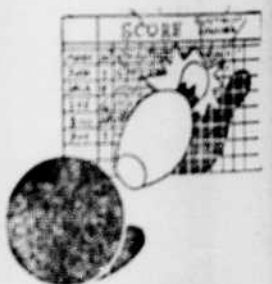
