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YW, YMCA to Conduct International Festival

Foreign students from colleges and universities throughout the state will come to Eugene for the YW-YMCA International Festival March 3.

The day's festivities, of this, the fifth annual event of its kind on the campus, will be centered around a luncheon, coffee hour, dinner, and later in the evening a dance.

Last year called the International Fun Fest, the event has been renamed this year because of the added serious note, a luncheon discussion conducted by Clifford E. Maser, dean of the School of Business and Technology at Oregon State College.

Maser is well qualified to speak to this cosmopolitan gathering, having studied at the University of Cologne in Germany and at the

University of Vienna, Austria. A member of the executive board of the American Friends' Service Committee, Maser is also on the board of directors of the Oregon Council of Churches.

The discussion will be for the purpose of helping foreign students in this country to know how better to interpret their country to the Americans, and how, on their return to their homeland, to interpret America to their fellow countrymen. The luncheon will be held at 12 noon in the Student Union cafeteria.

Following the luncheon will be a coffee hour from 3 to 5 p.m. in Gerlinger Hall. During this informal "get acquainted" hour, there will be entertainment by the foreign student's cosmopolitan Club under the direction of Dirk Schepers, from Holland. Selections on the program will include a violin solo by Ellen Liebe, senior in music from Eugene; a Guatamalan dance by Victoria Perez; German folk songs by the German group, led by Wilfred Maeding; a French duet by Pierre "King of Hearts" Pasquio and Maurice Morello; a Japanese dance by June Nakada and Yoshiko Seki; a Philippine dance by Glory Galia and Celia Olivar; and the dramatizing of an American folk song by the YWCA freshman music commission.

Additional entertainment will be put on by the Oregon State Cosmopolitan Club. All of the entertainment will be done in native costume.

At 5:30 p.m. in Gerlinger sun porch, a dinner for foreign and American students will be prepared and served by the Sophomore Commission social chairman, Mimi Jones and Sue Lichty.

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
