



## **Eugene Hospital Okayed** for Interns

EUGENE -(A)- Sacred Heart Hospital has been approved by the American Medical Association as a center for training medical interns, Dr. Sidney Hoffman, chairman of the medical staff's intern committee, reported today.

The training program will be-gin July 1, 1952, he said. Approval has been granted for training six interns.

Dr. Hoffman said construction of a new \$1,500.000 wing at Sacred Heart, now being built, was a large factor in winning approval of the intern training application.

He pointed out that no other Oregon hospital, outside of Portland, has been approved for internships.
