**ATOCinderChamp For Second Season With Win Over SAE**

Alpha Tau Omega won its second straight University dual track meet championship yesterday by tripping Sigma Alpha Epsilon for the IM cinder crown, 48-20.

ATO presented a well-rounded track squad, with few outstanding performers, but enough consistency to come through with Bill Bowerman's school track cup for the second straight year. A win next year for the Taus would retire the cup to them.

The events of yesterday's meet resulted in:

**Broad jump**—Hal Davis of SAE won with a jump of 19 feet and 6 inches. Second was ATO Dave Crockatt and third was his team mate, Harold Brainerd.

**Shot put**—Won by SAE Len Diedrichs with a heave of 42 feet, 3 inches. Jerry Shaw and Jerry Moshofski of ATO were second and third, in that order.

**High jump**—Ron Lyman of ATO won at 5 feet, 9 inches. Tied for second were Bob Buckley of SAE and ATO Dan Cuddahy.

**Hurdles**—Won in 5.8 seconds by Ron Lyman of ATO. Cuddahy was second for the Taus and Buckley took third for SAE.

**Pole vault**—Won at 10 feet 6 inches by Ron Reeves of ATO. SAE Ed Kerahner was tied for second with ATO Dick Jones.

**40-yard dash**—Won in 4.8 inches by Brainerd of ATO. Davis of SAE was second.

**Three-quarter mile**—Joe Kennedy of ATO won in 3 minutes, 44.3 seconds. Brethauer took a close second and Pat Dignan of SAE was a tight third. The race was a four-man affair the entire distance, with SAE Bill Johnson finishing fourth by a close margin.

**Relay**—Won by ATO's Lyman, Cuddahy, Brethauer, and Brainerd. Time: 16.4.
