

## Religious Study To be Subject Of 2 Seminars

Two six-week seminars on the study of religion will be sponsored this term by Wesley House and Westminster Foundation.

Registration for the seminars will begin today at Wesley, Westminster, or the Student Union.

The first, "Foundations of Our Culture," will be taught by N. P. Jacobson, head of the department of religion. First meeting of the seminar will be held at 4 p.m. today in the Student Union.

"The Role of the Church in Contemporary Society," will be the subject of the second seminar which will meet at 6:30 p.m. Thursdays in the Student Union beginning this week. Six different lecturers will conduct the seminar alternately.

This week "The Historical Role" will be discussed by Quirinus Breen, professor of history and social science.

Other subjects and speakers will be "Judaism," by Rabbi E. Charles Sydney of Portland; "Catholicism," by Father Leo Linehan Chaplain of Newman Club, Eugene; "Protestantism," by the Rev. Berlyn Faris, of the First Methodist Church, Eugene; "Small Sects in America," by Dr. Carrol Roberts, of the First Christian Church, Eugene; and "The Church in the Future," by Dr. Wesley G. Nicholson, of the First Congregational Church, Eugene.

Horace Robinson will direct the play assisted by Patricia Saunders, Robert Cunningham and Vic Weidensee, graduate assistants in music, will conduct the orchestra. W. J. O'Leary, graduate assistant in music, will direct the 30 voice chorus. Dances will be staged by Bettie Owens, instructor in physical education.

The story evolves around Finian McLorergan who steals a crock of gold belonging to the leprechauns of Glocca Morra and comes to America with his daughter, Sharon. Finian buys the property of Susan Mahoney, a mute, and her brother, Woody, and buries the gold, thinking that because it is near Fort Knox it will multiply.

Sharon falls in love with Woody but things are complicated when Senator Billboard Rawkins, told by geologists that there is gold on the property, tries to condemn it under one of his own laws which forbids negro sharecroppers to build on the property. Sharon wishes that the senator were black so he could see the sharecroppers side and with the help of Og, a leprechaun, the wish comes true and the whole problem comes to a happy musical solution.

"Finian's Rainbow," which opened on Broadway in January, 1947, ran for 725 consecutive performances and was acclaimed by critics everywhere. It was written by E. Y. Harburg and Fred Saisy whose "Bloomer Girl" also enjoyed a long, prosperous run. The original dances were staged by Michael Kidd and the sets were designed by Jo Mielziner.
