

Sale of 'Kisties' Begins Wednesday

Ex-faculty Member Subject of Book

Willard E. Goslin, nationally known educator who taught at the University of Oregon during the summer of 1948, is the subject of a book "This Happened in Pasadena" by David Hulburd, published this week by The Macmillan Company.

"This Happened in Pasadena" is an account of events dating from

early 1948, when Willard Goslin was invited by Pasadena's Board of Education to become superintendent of its public schools, until the time, two and a half years later, when that same board requested his resignation.

The book illustrates how a local crisis in public education can be used by outside forces to further dangerous ends.
