

Webfoots Renew Linfield Rivalry

The Oregon Duck baseball nine, currently resting in fourth place in the Northern Division, will meet the Linfield Wildcats Thursday at McMinnville. The Ducks met Linfield in the season's opener for the Webfoots early in April, and Linfield took advantage of seven Oregon errors, the highest Duck total for the season, to win 10-6.

Rooks Win Two Over Ducklings

The OSC Rooks must have a jinx on the Oregon Ducklings in baseball. The Rooks made it four in a row over Coach Hal Zurcher's men as they swept a doubleheader played at Corvallis Friday, 5-2 and 5-4. This was the Baby Beavers' ninth straight win of the season.

Oregon pitchers Don Seigmund and Bill Bottler were rather stingy with hits, each giving five, but the Rooks were able to bunch theirs where they counted in both games.

Center fielder Duane Helbig tagged Seigmund for a homer in the third inning of the opener with two men on base. In the second tilt, Ron Fundingsland, clouted another homer off Bottler.

Norm Wellman and Dick Penrose stifled Duckling hitting efforts. Wellman allowed four safe blows and Penrose gave up six. A three-run Duckling rally fell one run short in the seventh frame of the second game.

The Ducklings have four more scheduled games with the Rooks. A Saturday tilt with the Central Catholic Rams at Eugene was rained out.

UO Golfers Win Dual Meet Title

The Oregon Golf team, winner of the Northern Division dual meet title, finished its undefeated dual meet season Friday with a 16½ to 10½ victory over the Oregon State Beavers.

Coach Sid Milligan's men will be favorites in the Northern Division tournament Saturday in Seattle. Last year the Ducks lost the tourney crown by one stroke to Oregon State.

Oregon took the best ball matches from the Beavers, 7 to 3 and eked out a 9½ to 7½ triumph in the singles play. Ron Clark, the Duck who burned up the WSC course last weekend with an eight-under-par 27 round, kept up the good work by downing Dick Yost, the top Orange divotter.

On a rain-swept Corvallis Country Club Course, Clark's 2 over par 73 was enough to top Yost's 75.

OSC's Jim Perry earned medal honors with a one-under-par 71.

This was the seventh straight victory for the Ducks. They won their sixth on Thursday as they trampled the University of British Columbia linksmen, 17½ to 13½, in a non-conference meet on the Eugene Country Club Course.

The Duck best ball duos of Ron Clark and Bob Atkinson, and Fred Mueller and Dave Frey swept their matches with UBC men Doug Bajus and Bob Esplen, and Gordy Christopher and Dick White.

Fred Mueller earned medalist laurels with a score of 70.

Jack Keller Wins The First Annual 'Emerald Trophy'

Driving Guard Jack Keller was awarded the "Emerald Athletic Trophy" Saturday for his basketball achievement, his scholarship, and his citizenship.

The newly-established award was made at the Junior Prom by Athletic Director Leo Harris. The trophy was presented on behalf of the athletic department and the Daily Emerald.

Keller recently won the University Man's Shop Award when he was selected by teammates as the outstanding member of the varsity basketball squad.

Keller was picked by the coaches as one of the outstanding guards in the Northern Division in 1950 and 1951. His greatest value was his driving and inspirational teamwork. He led the team in assists this year 62.

Coach John Warren rated Keller highly for his athletic ability, leadership, willingness to work, and performance. He competed in three major sports—basketball, baseball, and track—in his freshman year.

The trophy winner was selected by a committee composed of Leo Harris, athletic director; Orlando J. Hollis, PCC faculty representative; Art Litchman, director of the athletic news bureau; Barry Mountain, ASUO president; Tommy Edwards, president of the Order of the "O"; Phil Johnson, sports editor of the Emerald; and Dick Strite, sports editor of the Eugene Register-Guard.

The Oregon-Oregon State dual track meet, scheduled for Saturday afternoon, was cancelled as a result of undue precipitation and was rescheduled for 4 p.m. Tuesday.

Oregon has won 19 dual meets from the Beavers while losing 13. The Ducks have won 13 of the last 16 meets with the Staters, including a row between 1933 and 1940.

Oregon will compete in the Northern Division Meet next Saturday at Pullman, the Pacific Coast Conference Meet May 25 and 26 at Los Angeles, and possibly the N.C.A.A. Meet June 15 and 16 at Seattle.

The Ducks also will participate in the annual Big Ten-PCC Meet June 19 at Eugene.
