**Butane Explains Simple System For Registration**

University registration for fall term will be completely simplified, Donald Butane, director of the few-who study, announced today.

Main point of the new policy was explained as "atomic" in effect—causing but one huge explosion of temper instead of the customary 50, Butane lisped.

This simple process will take only six weeks to complete, Butane noted, and with the late fee deadline extended to the third week of school, will permit greater "financial security" for the university.

The new registration plan consists of but one card for upper division students, and only 17 1/4 for lower division applicants. (Except freshmen, who must complete an additional 13 cards.)

Upper division students will have a definite psychological advantage in completing registration, Butane explained. The one card, 27 inches wide and 46 long, will be of chartreuse stock, printed with pink ink.

"There will be a few complaining students," Butane said, "but we must keep up with tradition—a different system at each registration."
