Horowitz Given Biochemistry Award for Study

Myer G. Horowitz, graduate assistant in chemistry, has been awarded a post-doctoral fellowship in biochemistry for the coming year by the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis.

Horowitz, who will receive a doctor's degree in biochemistry in September, will use the fellowship to continue training at the University.

According to F. J. Reithel, associate professor of chemistry under whom Horowitz is studying, the money given by the foundation is used for the future training of promising young PhD's in order that they may get advance training in problems relating to medicine. This fellowship is the first one awarded by the Infantile Paralysis Foundation to a student choosing to continue his work at the University of Oregon. Reithel believes Horowitz is the third student to study under him to receive a fellowship.
