## Air ROTC Application Still Due

Applications for advanced Air Force ROTC will continue to be accepted through the end of spring term, it has been announced by Lt. Col. E. L. Hibner, head of the Air ROTC section of the military department.

To qualify for enrollment in advanced Air ROTC an applicant must have completed or contemplate completing two years of basic ROTC this term and have two full academic years remaining at the University, or be a veteran of at least 12 months service and have at least two full academic years remaining at the University.

The University of Oregon Air ROTC program at the present time offers two options in the advanced course—administration and logistics and a course in comptrollership. Two additional options will be available for advanced student beginning next fall term. The options are known as General Technical and Flight Operations.

The training option General Technical is open to students majoring in science and mathematics. This course is designed to point out primary technical fields and related equipment used in the U. S. Air Force. The subject matter will enable the student to apply his related University studies and civilian background in a technical Military Occupational Specialty.

The second new training option is known as Flight Operations. This course is designed to provide instruction which will facilitate and materially augment the academic phases of training in the flying schools of the Air Force. A portion of the instruction will be devoted to include the mission, organization, types of equipment, and method of operations of the major units of the Air Force. The remaining portion of instruction will be devoted to instruction in principles of flight, aircraft engineering, and introduction to instruments, air navigation, meteorology, and new developments in the field.

In conjunction with the Flight Operations program. There is a possibility that voluntary basic flight training up to 25 hours may be offered with this option pending final approval of Congress.

Qualified students may request applications for advanced Air ROTC course at the information window in the military department building.
