### Soprano Wagner To Give Recital In SU Ballroom

The music school, with the cooperation of the Student Union Board, will present Hildegard Wagner, dramatic soprano, in recital at 8 p.m. today in the Student Union Ballroom.

This will be the first of many student recitals to be held in the Student Union. Previously, only the Music School Auditorium has been available for use by these advanced students in music.

The program, which consists largely of popular arias and songs, is as follows:

"Widmung," by Schumann, "Verborgtheit," by Hugo Wolf, "Die Mainacht," by Brahms, and "Er der Herrlichste" by Schumann.

"Pace, Pace, Pace" (from "La Forza del Destino"), by Verdi, will comprise the second part of the program.

The third part will consist of "Mignon," by Hugo Wolf, and "Zueignung," by Richard Strauss; "Jai Luli," by Coquard; "Over the Steppe," by Gretchaninoff; "To the Children," by Rachmaninoff; "Waves Dashing and Breaking," by Rimsky-Korsakoff will be presented in the fourth.

The fifth and final part of the program will be selections from a song cycle, "Paris," by Manning; and "Spring Came," by Edwin McArthur. The selections from Manning will be "River Boats," "The Lamplighter," and "Paris."
