More Parking Spaces Available to Visitors

Official visitors to the University including mothers and dads and others who have business on the campus, will find more adequate parking space under new regulations adopted during the summer by the campus planning committee

The committee is composed of Sidny W. Little, Dean of the School of Architecture and Allied Arts; J. O. Lindstrom, Business Manager, I. I. Wright, Superintendent of the physical plant, and William Jones, Dean of Administration.

As part of the plan to provide more parking for visitors, city meters have been installed on two streets running through the campus. These meters, on one side only, are in front of Emerald Hall on 13th street where formerly there was no parking at all and on University Street across from the student union.

In addition, four spaces have been reserved for visitors in the Johnson Hall parking lot, according to Wright. This lot, under the new rules, will be entirely reserved for administrative personnel having to use their cars regularly on business. It is the only lot so reserved, Wright said, although two spaces are set aside for doctors and two for state cars in the Emerald Street parking lot.

All other parking lots have been opened for both student and faculty parking on a first-come-first-served basis, Wright said. These include lots at 13th and Emerald Streets, behind Friendly Hall, at 14th and Kincaid, across 11th street from the University Theatre in front of Susan Campell Hall, south of the student union and the lot behind the school of education

In all these lots will accommodate approximately 550 cars. Additional parking areas behind the music school, at the warehouse and around the Vet's dorms hold 225 cars.

Discussion Group To Meet Today

A new discussion group on great books will hold its first meeting on the Oregon campus at 8 p.m. today in 319 SU.

The group, which is a part of a national organization for reading and discussion of great works of literature, will hold meetings on the first and third Wednesdays of each month during the school year.
