

## Oregon Freshman Football Candidates Include Former Prep Quarterbacks

Quarterbacks George Shaw of Grant High in Portland and Wally Russell of Eugene High rank among the top freshmen gridgers who have selected the University of Oregon for their college football careers.

Shaw, a 1950 Oregon high school all-stater, has three other brothers who have performed in college grid circles. Brother Jerry, a 225-pound tackle, the heaviest man on the Duck squad, earned a Web-foot letter in 1950 and is back for more action this fall.

Tom Shaw starred at Stanford University, and Jack Shaw played football at Portland University.

Russell was selected as the most valuable player in the annual Shrine high school game in Portland. He led the Eugene Axemen to the district championship in 1950.

Duck halfback candidates include two other freshmen from Eugene High, Merritt and Manning Barber. The Barber twins starred in the 1951 Shrine game. Manning, an all-state prep selection, plays at right half, and Merritt performs at the opposite position.

Eugene High also furnishes a freshman fullback candidate. John Reed saw three years of Army service after graduating from the local prep institution. Reed, who played football for two seasons at Fort Ord and one season at Newberg (New York) Preparatory, is the son of Dick Reed, former Oregon captain assistant coach.

Another yearling, Lou Kollias of Elizabeth, Pennsylvania, might see linebacking action as a defensive fullback.

### End Candidates

Freshman end candidates include Farrell Albright, Dick Davenport, Harold Reeve, and Dean Van Leuven. Albright played halfback at Milwaukie High, averaging over nine yards per rushing (Please turn to Page 9)

## Portland Meeting Lineup Released

The Oregon Ducks will enter a new grid season under a new coach when they battle the Stanford Indians in the season opener for both squads at 1:30 p.m. Saturday in Portland's Multnomah Stadium.

Webfoot Coach Len Casanova, ex-Santa Clara grid star and head coach, will start an offensive lineup consisting of six Duck lettermen, four transfers, and one non-letterman from the 1950 Oregon squad.

Starting at quarterback in the Duck T formation will be Letterman Hal Dunham, a 185-pound junior who practiced daily under the coaching of Norm Van Brocklin during spring practice. Barney Holland, George Shaw, and Wally Russell

provide reserve strength at the signal-calling position.

### Edwards Starts

Veteran Tommy Edwards is scheduled to start at left half. The tricky 166-pound junior excels at pass receiving, running, punt and kickoff returns, and defense.

Tom Lyon, a transfer, will probably start at right half with Letterman Ron Lyman in the fullback position.

Monte Brethauer, another letterman, is expected to start at left end. He holds the Duck record for passes caught in a single game and in a single season.

Starting at left tackle will be Transfer Mike Sikora, who once played fullback at Indiana U.; Don McCauley, a veteran of the 1950 Duck campaign, will start at left guard.

### Veteran at Center

Dick Patrick, a two-year letterman, is slated for starting duties at center. Emmett Williams, non-letterman who demonstrated great improvement during spring practice, is listed at right guard in the tentative Duck starting lineup.

Two junior college transfers, Right Tackle Bill Bates and Right End LeRoy Campbell, complete the Oregon offensive starting list.

Other possible starters include Fullback Tom Novikoff, Right Half Bob Ashworth, Left Half Ted (Please turn to Page 9)
