An expanded counseling and guidance program in University dormitories goes into effect this week as students arrive on the campus. This year special attention is being directed toward the new all-freshman dormitory units.

Anderson, Right End Hal Reeve, Right Tackle Len Diederichs, and Left Guard Gerry Moshofsky.

Coach Chuck Taylor's Stanford T formation offensive platoon includes Quarterback Gary Kerkorian, one of four starting seniors; Left Half Bob Meyers, former fullback; Right Half Ron Cook, a sophomore who also plays defensive safety; and Fullback Skip Crist, whose understudy is decathlon expert Bob Mathias.

Indian Linemen
Starting Indian linemen probably will consist of Left End Bill Storum, Left Tackle Carter Pyle, Left Guard Norm Manogian, Center Rod Garner, Right Guard Jack Bonetti, Right Tackle John Broderick, and Right End Bill McColl.

Oregon's starting line averages 197 pounds and the backs average 183. They'll face the Stanford defensive line, which averages 208, and defensive backfield, which averages 187.

The grid clash will feature the 20th meeting between the two two schools. Stanford has won 14, and Oregon 4, and one game ended in a 7-7 deadlock.

Stanford was victorious in the first 11 meetings, but the Webfoots have been more successful during recent years, winning the last two games (1947 and 1948).
