The stanine system is a new method in use for the first time this year. It was developed by the and is now being used by all of the state colleges. Its goal is to equalize the number of students in each numerative group. This was impossible while the decile system was in use, and resulted in a large number of students being bunched into the 4 to 7 category, with only a few students spread out from 1 to 3 and from 7 to 9.

The stanine number is figured on the basis of the number of A's a student has on his record. A person having a large number of A's receives a high stanine rating, while a student who has only a few A's and many B's and C's receives a lower rating.
