

University Band African Sculptures Features Twin To Be Shown at SU

The University Band, divided into men's and women's marching bands, will present several marching figures or skits before the game and during the halftime Saturday on Howe Field.

This is the first year that a university women's marching band has been arranged. This arrangement was due to the draft law which cut down the normal 100-piece men's band to 70.

Several of the figures which will be presented are: 75th Anniversary symbols, a flower, a heart, and an Oregon "O". All this will be done to the marching accompaniment of such songs as "Rhapsody in Blue," "Summertime," "Love Walked In," and "I Got Plenty of Nothing."

53 Sundays will appear in five out of twenty-eight years.

The circulating exhibition of African sculptures from the Segy Gallery in New York City will go on display for a three-week period beginning Monday in the Student Union art gallery.

Donna Covalt, SU art gallery chairman, is in charge of the exhibition. Recordings of primitive music will be played Monday evening as a part of the opening day of the exhibition.

The exhibition of original, antique African sculpture shows the primeval creations of native societies and serve as a basis for comparison with works of other civilizations, cultures and people.

The group of twenty sculptures, representing the outstanding art-producing tribes of West Africa, functioned as an integral part of magico-religious ceremonies.

Term of Stanine Confuses Rush

Prospective freshman rushees who are confused about the 3 stanine required for rushing may be relieved to know that the number on the admission slips represented as a decile is actually a stanine. This stanine runs from a low of 1 to high of 9.

The stanine system is a new method in use for the first time this year. It was developed by the State System of Higher Education, and is now being used by all of the state colleges. Its goal is to equalize the number of students in each numerative group. This was impossible while the decile system was in use, and resulted in a large number of students being bunched into the 4 to 7 category, with only a few students spread out from 1 to 3 and from 7 to 9.

The stanine number is figured on the basis of the number of A's a student has on his record. A person having a large number of A's receives a high stanine rating, while a student who has only a few A's and many B's and C's receives a lower rating.

Free Chest X-rays To Continue

Chest X-rays will be given throughout next week in the infirmary, Dr. F. N. Miller, director of the health service, has announced.

Student response to the X-ray program has been very slow so far, Miller stated.
