Saturday provided other interesting statistics, namely Michigan's minus 23 yards rushing and plus 29 passing for a net total of 6 yards gained—against the tight Michigan State defense.

That should increase Oregon State's national stature, since the Beavers lost only 6-0 to Michigan State. The Corvallis Aggie 61-28 reduction of Utah also made OSC's gridders appear to have better-than-average strength.

The Ags picked up 616 yards on the ground with Dave "Super" Mann accounting for 233 on 11 attempts. Reports indicate that OSC's "best team since 1942" might be headed for the Rose Bowl. Their suicide schedule (USC, Cal and Stanford down in California) might interfere; if not, Oregon might be able to do something about it.

McArthur Court Program of Artists Released by Civic Music Association

The Civic Music association Monday released its full schedule of artists who will appear on this season's CMA program at McArthur court.

The program includes contralto Marian Anderson, the Robert Shaw chorale, cellist Gregor Piatigorsky, the Portland Symphony—with soprano Marie Rogndahl as soloist, baritone Robert Weede, the piano duo team of Arthur Gold and Robert Fisdale, and pianist William Kapell.

Admission to the series, the schedule of which was released by CMA president T. McKenzie Alexander, is by season ticket only for adults, including family and administration, and by student body cards for students.

Founder of Home Ec Department Dies

The founder of what became the home economics department at the University of Oregon, Lillian Ella Tingle, died Sunday in a Eugene hospital. She was 79.

Founder of the University department of household arts in 1917 on a budget of \$1 per student, she retired from active teaching in 1932. She pioneered in home economics teaching in Oregon and wrote widely on homemaking subjects.

Born in England, she came to the United States in 1899 and taught in North Dakota until 1905 when she moved to Portland. She taught in Portland until 1917 when Prince Campbell, president of the University at that time, hired her to teach a course in wartime cooking. Her course became the foundation for the home economics department.

The title of Bachelor of Arts may be abbreviated "A.B." or "B.A."

3 Added to Architecture Staff
