Vet Bonus Blanks Ready in Emerald

Oregon bonus applications may be had by veterans registered in the university at the office of Ray Hawk, director of men's affairs.

A veteran of World War II, who was a resident of the state of Oregon for at least one year immediately preceding induction, is eligible to apply for the bonus, according to Hawk. Veterans may receive up to \$600 under the law, which was passed during the last session of the state legislature.

Actual payment of the compensation may be delayed until the federal government's credit restraint regulations on the sale of bonus bond issues are relaxed. However, applications must be postmarked not later than Dec. 1, 1952, even though payment of the compensation may be delayed that date.
