Beall Gives Petrarch Lecture

A lecture on Petrarch, poet and humanist, given by Chandler B. Beall, professor of romance languages, comprised the second in the series of Browsing Room lectures scheduled for 7:30 every Wednesday night in the Student Union.

Petrarch, according to Beall, was instrumental in carrying over the literature of medieval period through to the Renaissance.

He is called the "father of the humanists" because of his interest in and study of what we now call the humanities. He had an insatiable love for reading, Beall said, which, coupled with his collecting of the literature of the period, added to our knowledge and general overall interests in books and things for which they stand.

His poetry, in the original Italian, had a musical quality and depth which his imitators found imitable, Beall declared, and was lost being translated to English.

Following his lecture, Beall answered questions raised by the audience, composed of faculty, students, and townspeople.

F. M. Combella, associate professor of classic languages, acted as discussion leader, adding comments and directing the audience participation.

Professors Contribute To New Book

Dr. Richard Littman, assistant professor of psychology in the university, and Dr. Ephraim Rose, former faculty member here, have had an article called "Molar and Molecular" published in "Psychological Theory," a new book which was published this month. The commentary first appeared in a professional periodical, "Psychological Review," three years ago.

The book was written by Dr. Melvin Marx of the University of Missouri.

Play titles for production three and four for the University theater schedule were nominated and the selection of these plays is to be announced within the next two weeks.

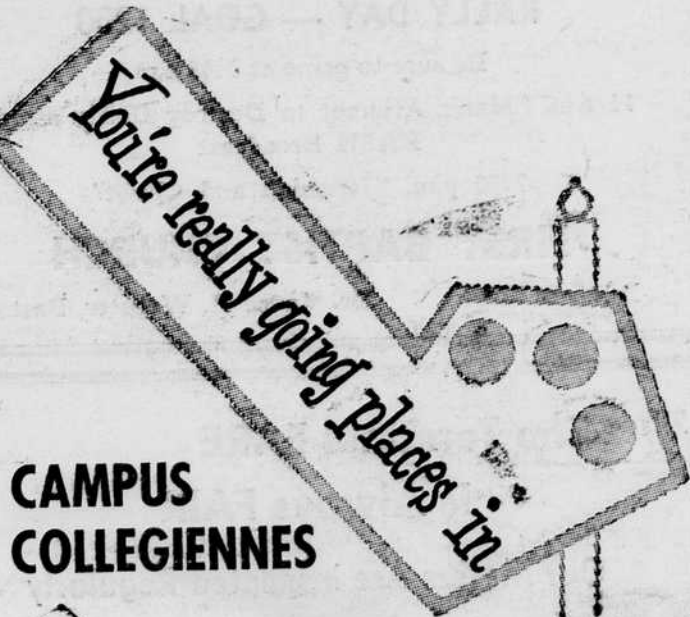
James River Highway bridge, near Newport News, Va., has a length including approaches of six miles.
