relation to social life and manners, and an ability to relate these first four powers to each other.

These powers cannot be denied, Castell asserted, so only one step is left for Arnold to trap Huxley. Using Huxley's agreement with Arnold, and also using his own powers of human beings, Arnold fashioned this statement as Huxley's contention, Castell pointed out, which follows logically: "To obtain knowledge of what reason requires of persons and a desire to make those requirements prevail, education concerned with things is as effectual as education concerned with persons." No reply ever came from Huxley, Castell said.

Arnold's introductory essay in "Essays in Criticism" has a universal greatness, Castell asserted. It has become somewhat of a scripture for human study. Concerned with the function of criticism, it says we must know the order to which things belong before we can tell what they actually are.
