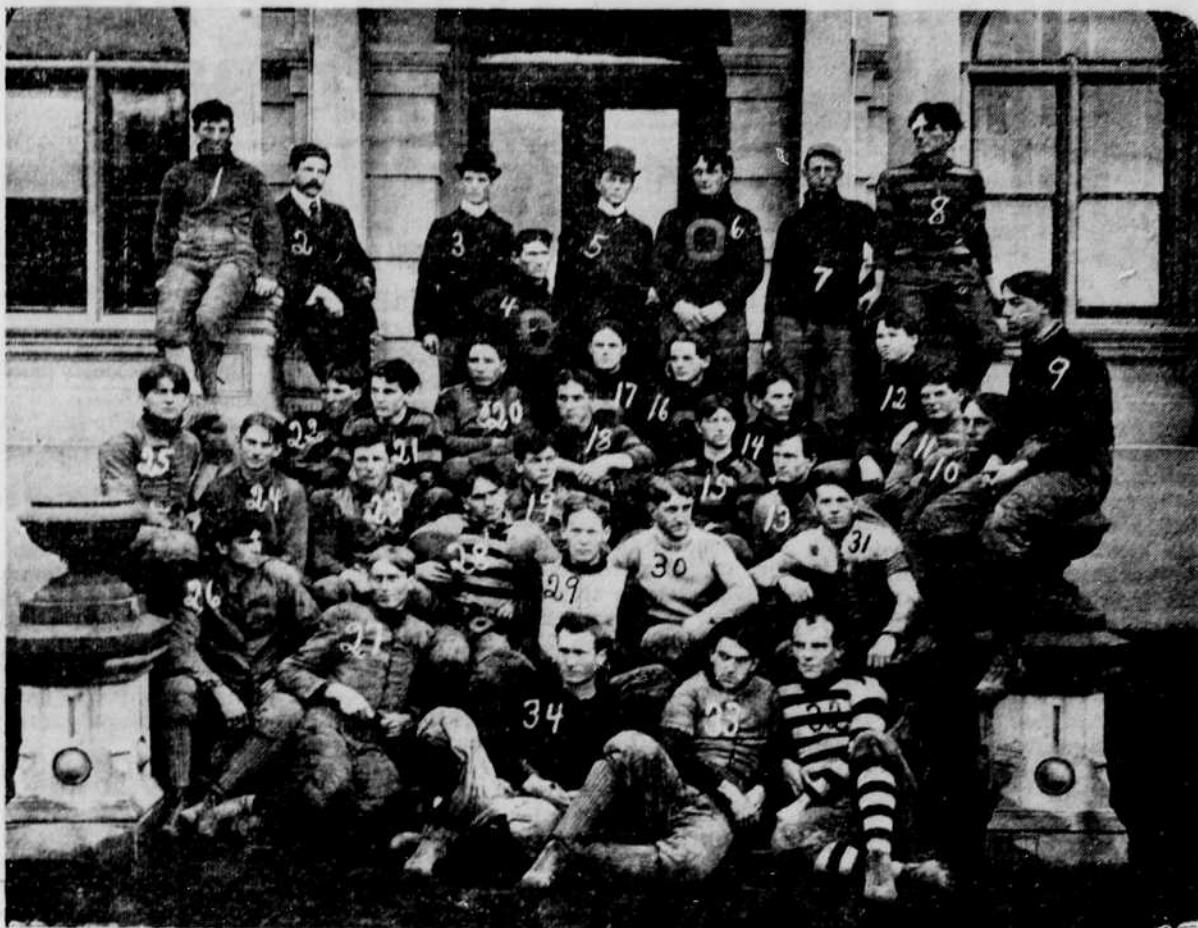


Green Machine of 1900

But that didn't satisfy. The mob roared down to the President's residence, still demanding a full day free for celebration. Another concession was made. Nine o'clocks could be cut. The mob continued to mill around.

About 9:30, another serpentine was formed and the students headed for town. They stopped at the Armory and tried to force their way in. The doors held against their onslaught, but entry was gained by a student climbing through a window and opening doors from the inside.

The mob poured inside. A few instruments were found and an improvised band began playing. The jubilant students danced in the makeshift ballroom until noon.

We had won. It meant something then.
