Novikoff collided with an Oregon blocker and was felled for a three yard set back on the State 42, but Dunham quickly recovered the yardage with an 11 yarder, the record setter to Brethauer.

Novikoff's long toss aimed for Campbell was deflected by OSC's Booth into the arms of Edwards on the two. Novikoff plunged into the middle for a yard and Edwards was caught on the half yard line, but the play was nullified because of a backfield in motion penalty.
