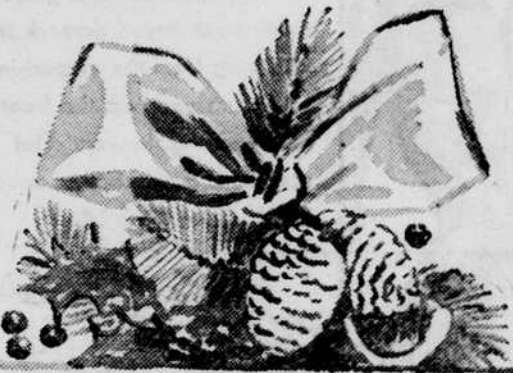

250 Freshmen Attend Class Meeting

Freshman winter term elections, plans for a new-type social program for freshman class spirit and freshman men's rushing were discussed at a meeting of the class of 1955 in the Student Union ballroom Wednesday.

About 250 freshmen turned out for the meeting. No chairs were set up for the session and class members sat on the canvas-covered ballroom floor.

Elections Jan. 23

Freshman elections will be held Wednesday, Jan. 23, ASUO Vice President Merv Hampton told the group. Petitions for office will be accepted until midnight Wednesday, Jan. 16. Formal presentation of candidates will be made Thursday, Jan. 17, at a nomination assembly.

Polls will be located in Carson hall, Hendricks hall, Vet's dormitory (two polling places) and on 13th ave. near the Co-op, Hampton said.

To run for office a candidate must have a 2.00 GPA. It will not be necessary to put down activities or suggestions on petitions. Petitions may be turned to Hampton or the ASUO office.

Nomination Assembly Rules

At the nomination assembly candidates will be introduced by a person of their choice who will be allowed to speak for two minutes on behalf of his candidate. Speeches by candidates will be limited to five minutes.

Offices open will be president, vice president, and two representatives. Candidates will run for the office of their choice. (Under the preferential voting system all candidates are in effect running for president. Voters will mark their ballots numerically, the figure one for the person they wish for president, the figure two for vice president, the figure three for their first choice for representative, the figure four for their second choice for representative.)

Any freshman who is listed by the Registrar's office may vote in the election. Registration cards must be presented and stamped before a freshman may vote.

Lack of Cooperation Stressed

The biggest problem of the freshman class in respect to social functions is the "lack of cooperation", Phil Dixon, freshman class social chairman, said.

Winter term freshman halls will be allowed to pick the type of so-

cial function they prefer and select the hall with which they wish to hold the function. This term pairings were arranged for the freshman. Halls may hold exchange dinners, firesides, exchange mixers, desserts or preference gatherings.

Dick McLaughlin, Inter Fraternity council president, explained the procedure to be used during freshman men's rushing which begins Jan. 8 and runs through Jan. 11. He termed fall term deferred rushing as "very successful." McLaughlin said he knew of only two cases in which fall term rushing regulations were violated.

Carey Speaks

ASUO President Bill Carey called upon the class to exhibit the type of class spirit which provides "mutual assistance and cooperation" during their school career.

Carey called the class "one of the most outstanding as far as intelligence that the University has seen for some time." He complimented the class in their protection of the Homecoming bonfire. It was the second bonfire in the University's 75-year history which escaped burning ahead of schedule, Carey said.

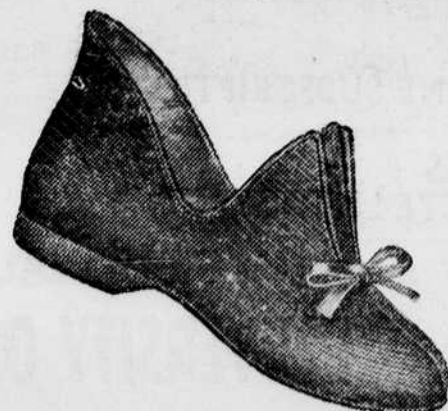
