JV's Slate Linfield, Pacific U.

It will be back into action for Coach Don Kirsch's jayvees this week when the squad encounters the Linfield Frosh and the Pacific JV's in a two game series at McArthur Court. Monday night the high-scoring jayvees will take on Linfield in a game which promises a lot of action and Tuesday night they will meet the JV's from Pacific. Both games will serve as preliminaries to the Oregon-Washington State series and will get under way at 6 p.m.

Thus far the Ducklings have enjoyed a better than average season; winning all but one of their six games. Partly responsible for this has been Larry Chamberlain, a courtwise all-stater from Salem, who currently holds top rung in team scoring with 58 points.

Not far behind is sophomore Ron Phillips with 43. Don Siegmund ranks third with 32 counters. Top average goes to Ron Bottler, who has racked up thirty points in two games for a 15 per game average.

The squad, idle since December 22, will be somewhat reduced for the Monday night game against Linfield, with only the freshmen seeing action. However, the entire team will be eligible for the Pacific game. Top five scorers are as follows:

Mermen To Meet Aero Club Team

Swimming Coach John Borchardt is preparing his Oregon pool team for their first meet of the season against the Aero Club at the Men's Pool on Saturday. The Duck swimmers, who finished second to Washington in the Conference last year, have a good chance to duplicate that performance in the current season's competition.

Four Lettermen

The nucleus of the squad is composed of four returning lettermen from last year's team. They are Dick Ruchdeschel, a senior and the only returning two year letter winner; Mike Popovitch, senior; Gordon Edwards, junior; and Jim Allan, junior.

Non-lettermen returning from last year's team follow; John English, Bob Oringdolph, Cedric Baldwin, Allan Wahinekona, Harry Atkinson, and Henry Kalura.

New men out for the first time this year are: Dave Houch, Yoshinobu Terada, Phil Lewis, Harry Fuller, Milton Kotoshirodo, Herb West, and Pete Charlton.

Two of the above have been named by Borchardt as potential stars. Sophomore Pete Charlton is expected to provide ample skill on the diving board, while Yoshinobu Terada will give a good account of himself in the 150 yard distance medley, won last year by Washington's All-American, Pete Salmon. Terada is a transfer from the University of Hawaii.

Bill Borchner Makes ND Debut Tonight

There's a first time for everything, and Oregon basketball coach Bill Borchner will pilot a team in Northern Division competition Monday night for the initial time in his career. His Ducks, sporting a record of five wins and seven losses in non-conference action, and just back Friday from an extended holiday tour of the Bay area, will be pitted against Coach Jack Friel's WSC Cougars.

The 32-year-old Borchner, who came to Oregon after a brilliant career at Marshfield high school, had this to say about his Northern Division debut:

Good Chance Seen

"It's uncertain how we will come out against WSC, because we have sometimes performed well in the pre-season games, and other times not so well. I do think that if we play the kind of basketball we are capable of, we have a good chance against the Cougars."

The crew from the Palouse Hills swings into Eugene after splitting a two game series with the OSC Beavers Friday and Saturday nights. They lost the first tilt, but came strongly to post a 54-44 victory Saturday after being tied 37-37 with five minutes left.

Scoring leader Saturday night was Forward Eric Roberts, six-foot, three-inch senior from Hollywood, California, who had 18 points. The lanky Cougar, also ND high jump champion, is also potent on the backboards.

Rosser Scores 15

Another Cougar to watch is George Rosser, six-foot, two-inch center from Bellingham, and co-captain along with Roberts. Rather short for a center, Rosser uses his 205 pounds to advantage under the backboards. Saturday night he scored 15 points and was instrumental in the Cougar victory.

Also in the starting lineup for the Cougars, who use two platoons extensively, will be Phil Brown and Bob Swanson at the guards. Brown, a six-foot, three-inch sophomore, sparkled Saturday. He scored 11 points and was potent on the defensive boards in the final-quarter Cougar surge to victory.

Swanson, another six-foot, three-inch sophomore, is a defensive specialist. At the other forward spot will be Peter Mullins, Australia's six-foot, four-inch contribution to U.S. basketball. Mullins is a fine floor man and a deadly shot. He was captain of the all-Australia hoop team in 1949, and also placed sixth in the decathlon event for Australia in the 1948 Olympics.

The Cougars have a fine record in non-conference competition, having 10 non-conference wins and only four defeats, with nine victories in their last 10 games.

WSC Leads All-Time Series

Last season WSC finished third in the ND, with seven wins and nine losses. In four games with Oregon, the Ducks won three; sweeping the Eugene pair 66-57 and 57-55. At Pullman the Cougars took the first contest, 66-63, but lost 54-52 to Oregon in the second.

The all-time won and lost record between Oregon and WSC stands at 53 wins for the Cougars to 49 for the Ducks.

For Coach Bill Borchner's Oregon Ducks, starting at forward will be six-foot, five-inch Bob Peterson, All-Northern Division last season, and possessor of a sparkling 15.2 points per game average for 182 points in the 12 non-conference. Also one of the top rebounders in the nation, Peterson will be marked man against WSC.

Streeter Improving

At the other forward for the Ducks will be Mel Streeter, six-foot, four-inch senior from Los Angeles. Streeter is also potent on the backboards, and is giving indications of developing into a scoring threat, with 72 points in pre-season play.

At the pivot position will be six-foot, eight-inch Chet Noe, an improving junior, also from Los Angeles. Noe has 150 points and a 12.8 average to put him second on

Peterson in the 12 games this year.

Ken Hunt, captain of the squad, will contribute his steadiness and deadly shooting to the Duck backcourt crew. The six-foot senior from Marshfield is third in scoring with 114 points for a 9.5 per game average.

Rounding out Borchner's starting five is Kenny Wegner, former Roosevelt high school flash. Five-

foot, eleven-inch Wegner, a sophomore, broke into the starting lineup over the holidays, and his fast, driving style of play has accounted for 94 points for a 7.8 average.

Top reserves for the Ducks loom as Barney Holland, six-foot sophomore from Coos Bay; Ron Bottler, freshman guard from Roosevelt high school; Jim Vranizan, foot, four-inch senior center; Keith Farnum, six-foot, four-inch southpaw forward from Salem; and Bob Hawes, hot shooting sophomore guard from Bend.

Borchner's Webfoots ran through a light workout on McArthur Court, Sunday afternoon, and at 6:00 p.m. Sunday evening, the Cougars took over the local maple boards.

Oregon Seen in Third

The experts have tabbed the Ducks and Cougars to fight it out with OSC for third place in the Northern Division, while Washington and Idaho are rated one-two. The Vandals surprised the Huskies with a victory Friday night, but the men of Tippy Dye, minus star Center Bob Houbregs, crushed Idaho 61-42 Saturday night.

Evy Resigns At WSC--Signs Iowa Contract

IOWA CITY, IA.,—(U.P.)—Forest Evashevski, former star Michigan quarterback, quit Washington State today and was promptly hired as head football coach of the University of Iowa.

The 33-year-old Evashevski will replace Leonard Raffensperger, who has been under sharp criticism for Iowa's poor showing last fall. The Hawkeyes failed to win a Big Ten game and scored only two victories all season.
