Suggest Football Curbs

WASHINGTON, — (U.P.) — A special committee of 11 college presidents began the job today of drawing up a formal code for controlling and de-emphasizing inter-collegiate sports.

Chairman John A. Hannah, president of Michigan State college, said the proposed code would follow the line of earlier recommendations made by the committee, including an end to post-season football games and strict control over the recruiting and subsidization of athletes.

Janowicz Wins Duel

HONOLULU, T.H., — (U.P.) — Ohio State's versatile Vic Janowicz quarterbacked the College All-Stars to a 41-40 victory over the Hawaii All-Stars before a capacity crowd of 26,000 fans attending the annual Hula Bowl football game here this afternoon.

The Hawaii team, bolstered by professionals Frankie Albert and Kyle Rote, almost overtook the All-American-studded collegiate team after trailing 27-13 at half-time and 41-26 at the start of the last period.

Hawks Have Him

IOWA CITY, IA., — (U.P.) — Forest Evashevski, freshly resigned from Washington State, where he turned out the best Cougar football team in 20 years, will take over as head coach at Iowa Feb. 1 and try to do the same thing for the Hawkeyes.

The 33-year-old former star Michigan quarterback was named to the Iowa post a few hours after he quit his \$12,000-a-year job at Washington State.

He succeeds Leonard Raffensperger, 48, who has been under fire since last fall, when the Hawkeyes failed to win a Big Ten game.

Ducks Throttle WSC, Take ND League Lead

Coach Bill Borchers made his Northern Division debut in fine style Monday night as his Oregon Ducks overcame a 26-22 halftime deficit to surge ahead in the third quarter to win going away by a 59-45 margin.

There seemed to be a lid on the basket for the Ducks as the game started, and they missed 14 straight shots before Hank Bonnemant tipped in a rebound with 1:45 left in the initial quarter.

The score at the end of the first stanza was 14-6 in favor of the Cougars, who were led by a cool, sharpshooting sophomore named Phil Brown who potted four field

goals from his guard position.

Borchers' Dixieland jazz in the dressing room must have inspired the Ducks, for they led off with third period jump shots by Ron Bottler and Chet Noe, plus a lay-in by Peterson to tie the score 28-all.

George Rosser had said a tip-in for WSC.

Then Eric Roberts hit a jump shot from the key and put the Cougars in the lead again. Bottler freshman Duck guard, made a free throw on his second try given him by virtue of the new defensive foul shot rule made it 30-29, and Barney Holland followed with another

charity toss to tie the score again, 30-all. Bob Peterson got a tip-in, but the sharpshooting Phil Brown countered with a swisher from the corner to tie the count at 32-apiece, and Pete Mullins sunk a free throw to give WSC its last lead with 2:10 left in the third quarter.

Then the Ducks started to roll. Ken Hunt hit from the corner, Wegner, who played a driving game at guard, hit a free throw, and Hunt swished two more free throws. Chet Noe hooked one in as the quarter ended to make the score 39-33.

Peterson, Streeter, and Hunt scored in rapid succession after the fourth quarter started, which gave the Ducks a 12 point, 45-33 lead which they held and lengthened.

Peterson bore the scoring load with four straight field goals on nice shots during the rest of the game.

Oregon shot a torrid 437 in the last half, and had .290 for the game, while WSC hit an anemic .233 for the contest.

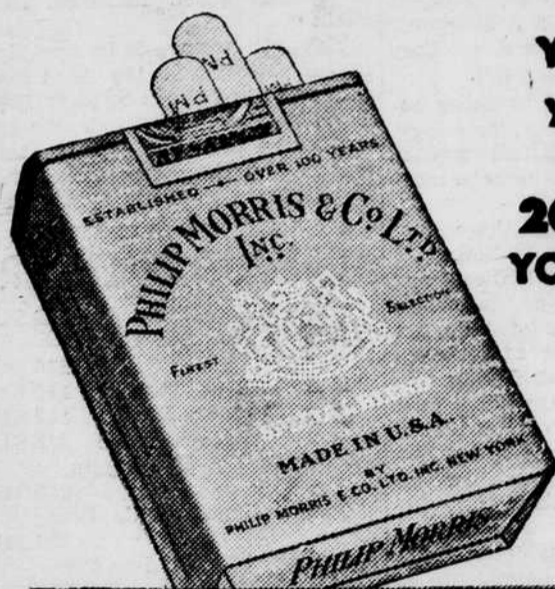
